ATTENTION AP Students: On Friday, 1/18, the SPHS's 2019 Advanced Placement Exam registration form was emailed to all AP students and family via Naviance and Blackboard Connect. The registration process begins on Friday, February 1, and SPHS will only accept payment by CHECK, made payable to SPUSD. Please note that the Early Bird registration rate is from Friday, February 1 to Friday, February 8 only, and that the registration fees increase as the AP exam date nears. Fee Reduction Waivers are available based upon financial need and qualification through our Food Services Nutrition Program. Fee waiver recipients must be identified by the HS Office of Curriculum no later than the reporting deadline of Friday, February 22. If you feel that you may be eligible for an AP fee waiver, or if you've previously received a fee waiver this school year and would like an AP fee waiver, please see Ms. Wong long before the Feb. 22 deadline!
