



## What does Transitional Kindergarten look like in Walnut Valley?

### Curriculum

- The Transitional Kindergarten curriculum is a hybrid that blends best practices from the pre-school learning environment with the best practices from the Kindergarten environment.
- Students will be introduced to age appropriate themes and literature through the Transitional Kindergarten curriculum.
- Math will be delivered using a hands-on approach.

### What does the classroom look like?

- **Classroom facility and teacher:** Transitional Kindergarteners have their own classroom with a fully credentialed Walnut Valley teacher.
- **Length of school day:** Students go to school every day the same hours as the Kindergarten classes at the school they are attending.
- **Learning environment:** Students learn by working with the teacher in small and large groups, participating in hands-on activities, interacting in centers, and learning through independent exploration.
- **Assessments**  
Age appropriate assessments will be used to monitor students' progress in early literacy readiness skills. In addition to parent conferences, students will receive report cards showing developmental, social, and academic progress.

## What is Transitional Kindergarten (TK)?

Transitional Kindergarten (TK) is a bridge between preschool and Kindergarten for children turning 5 years old on September 2 through December 2. It gives young learners a head start while providing them with an opportunity to learn and grow in an environment that is tailored to meet their developmental, emotional, academic, and social needs.



Transitional Kindergarten is the first of a two year Kindergarten experience. In the first year, TK students are provided with a program that takes into account the age and developmental ability of the children. The second year of the program consists of a regular standards-based Kindergarten, utilizing the California state standards.

## Differences between Transitional Kindergarten and Kindergarten

### Transitional Kindergarten

- Is a program that blends the California Common Core Standards for Kindergarten with the research findings on young children's developmental needs which place a high value on the arts, social skills, play, and integrated instruction
- Creates a bridge to success for Kindergarten
- Is the "gift of time" for children to be better prepared for Kindergarten and beyond
- Addresses the developmental, social, and emotional needs of young children in a hands-on learning environment
- Encourages oral language development which is the foundation for reading success

### Kindergarten

- Is based on Common Core Standards for Kindergarten with high expectations of mastery

*When Ryan first began Transitional Kindergarten, he had trouble focusing in class and struggled to write many words. After just a few months, Ryan's focus is much better and he is now able to write sentences. "He feels so much more confident now," says Ryan's mother. "Transitional Kindergarten was a perfect fit for him."*

## Who attends Transitional Kindergarten?

California SB1381 was passed in 2011, changing the age when children can begin Kindergarten. Under the law, a child must be five on or before September 1, 2014, to enroll in Kindergarten for the 2019-2020 school year.

The law also created Transitional Kindergarten so children who are affected by this change, those with birthdays between September and December, will be given "the gift of time" to develop their developmental, social, and academic skills and abilities. The time in Transitional Kindergarten will help students to succeed in Kindergarten, become leaders in the classroom, and confidently navigate the school-day routine.

A child whose birth date falls on September 2, 2014, through December 2, 2014, will be enrolled in Transitional Kindergarten for the 2019-2020 school year.
