Each fall, St. Jude seeks students interested in math, science, social sciences, STEM, engineering, and robotics. The **St. Jude Science Scholars of Tomorrow** program is designed to inspire students interested in math, science, social sciences, STEM, engineering, robotics, or healthcare to look at the broad range of possibilities for academic and career paths. This program is an opportunity to see and hear from scientists who work in the field every day.

The St. Jude Science Scholars of Tomorrow program is a symposium-style one day event. Students are selected through a competitive application process due to limited capacity. There is no cost to participate in this program. It will take place on Thursday, February 28, 2019. Participants in the program will get to:

- Attend scientific talks by renowned St. Jude scientists, including our CEO
- Tour labs and core facilities and hear about our specialized equipment and methods
- Interact with a panel of scientists and clinicians from many departments to hear about a range of career options
- Eat lunch with post-doctoral fellows to hear about academic and training experiences

Requirements:

- Students who attend the St. Jude Science Scholars of Tomorrow symposium must:
- Be at least 16 years old
- Be currently enrolled as a high school student within Shelby County
- Be able to provide transportation to and from St. Jude.

Application:

The application must be completed online. **All applications are due October 22, 2018.** Helpful hint: **Teachers have to complete part of the application, too, so don't wait to get started!**

Those who are accepted and attend will be required to make up any work this miss and the absences will be coded as a principal excused absence.
