You are automatically considered for some of those scholarships once you apply for admissions. For others a separate application is required.

| 01/07/19 | Santa Clara University Cristo Rey Annual Scholarship. Five full year tuition and fees; room and board; as well as books and other customary expenses will be given to CRN seniors who are admitted to Santa Clara University. Applicants must apply for admissions to Santa Clara University by January 7 regular decision deadline. (This is a new scholarship that will be awarded for the first time this year.) |
| 01/09/18 | Ron Brown Scholar. For African-American students. Academic achievement and community service. www.ronbrown.org |
| 01/15/19 | University of Oregon Cynthia and Edward Maletis Scholarship. One renewable scholarship of \$9,000. Open only to graduating seniors from DLSNC who will attend University of Oregon in Fall, 2019. Student must be Pell Grant eligible, Pathway Oregon eligible (3.40 gpa academic merit), resident of Oregon. Student must remain in good academic standing, making normal progress towards a degree in order to renew the scholarship each year. Student must apply to University of Oregon by 1-15-19. Completed application and a copy of Student Aid Report that shows EFC must be submitted by 2-15-19 to Mrs. Ward in the Counseling Office. University of Oregon Financial Aid Award Letter must be submitted to Mrs. Ward in the Counseling Office as soon as possible, no later than March 29, in order to be eligible for this scholarship. |

- 01/15/19 **University of Oregon Diversity Excellence Scholarship** – Up to \$6,000 a year for five years. Based on financial need, academic and extracurricular, contribution to UO diversity plan. Must apply online. Complete U of O admissions application by January 15.
- 01/15/19 **University of Oregon Presidential Scholarship.** Based on 3.85+ gpa, ACT composite score of 28, school and community activities. Complete U of O admissions application by Jan. 15. Complete Presidential Scholarship by Feb. 1.
- 01/15/19 **Pathway Oregon (University of Oregon).** Full amount for tuition, fees.
1.) To be considered for the program- Oregon resident, apply for admission by Jan. 15, 2019 to UO. *2.) To qualify for the program-* Have a completed FAFSA on file with UO by Feb. 15, 2019, meet income requirements, be eligible for a Pell Grant, complete and submit the completed application for either/both a General University Scholarship or a Diversity-Building scholarship. - 01/15/19 **Saint Mary's College of California Gael Scholar Awards.** \$19,000 annually. For entering freshmen with noteworthy extracurricular involvement and demanding college prep programs. Candidates typically have either 4.00 gpa or solid B averages combined with ACT composite scores greater than 26 or SAT greater than 1800.
- 01/15/19 **Saint Mary's College of California Freshman Honors at Entrance Scholarship.** \$22,000 annually. Entering freshmen admitted with a GPA of at least 3.7 and competitive ACT or SAT score will automatically receive this award.
- 01/15/19 **Saint Mary's College of California Presidential Scholars Scholarship.** \$25,000 annually. Only entering freshmen admitted with a high school GPA of at least 3.8 and a competitive ACT or SAT score are eligible to compete.
- 01/15/19 **Saint Mary's College of California Lasallian Leadership Scholarship.** \$13,000 annually. For entering freshmen admitted from a Lasallian high school with GPA of at least 3.5 or above.
- 01/18/19 **Hispanic Metropolitan Chamber Scholarship Program.** Award amounts generally range from \$1,000 to \$5,000. Must be of Hispanic heritage. GPA 3.00+. Apply online at www.hmccoregon.com
- 01/25/19 **Zeta Phi Beta Sorority Oregon Dove Scholarship.** For female high school seniors of African/African American descent. Criteria: 3.00+ gpa, two letters of recommendation, 500 word essay, 3x5 photo, transcript.

- 02/01/19 **Portland State University Multicultural Scholarships.** Various scholarships; must submit 400-word essays. Access Scholarship (focuses primarily on the African American college experience); Empower Scholarship (focuses on Asian American and Pacific Islander student experience); Ganas Scholarship (focuses primarily on the Latino/a student experience); Nations Scholarship (focuses primarily on the Native American/Alaskan Native student experience). Priority scholarship filing deadline date is February 1. Regular scholarship filing deadline date is March 1.
- 02/01/19 **Oregon State University Scholarships.** Various scholarships and awards. Priority Application and Scholarship filing deadline date.
- 02/01/19 **Eastern Oregon University Scholarships.** Various scholarships and awards. Early Action Application and Scholarship filing deadline date
- 02/01/19 **Jackie Robinson Foundation Scholarship – \$28,000 over four years.** For minority high school seniors who plan to attend a four-year college/university. Criteria includes: Leadership potential, community service, financial need, SAT/ACT. More details available at www.jackierobinson.org
- 02/04/19 **Al Forthan Memorial Scholarship.** \$10,000. One scholarship of \$2,500 a year for four years. For Oregon high school seniors who have been affected by addiction in your family or community. Criteria include an essay and letter of recommendation.
- 02/15/19 **Manhattan College Scholarships.** Lasallian Leadership Award. Essay and letter of recommendation regarding student's commitment to the Lasallian tradition in their community. Priority deadline is January 31.
- 02/15/19 **National Co-op Scholarship Program.** \$6,000 renewable for four years. Minimum 3.5 GPA and participation in college cooperative education at one of the following schools: Clarkson University, State University of New York Oswego, Drexel U., Johnson & Wales U., Merrimack College, Rochester Institute of Technology, U. Cincinnati, U. of Toledo, and Wentworth Institute of Technology. www.waceinc.org
- 02/23/19 **The Links, Incorporated Educational and Arts Scholarships.** \$1,000. For African American seniors who have demonstrated scholastic potential, high achievement, and leadership ability. Must submit essay and three letters of recommendation. GPA must be 3.00 or above.

- 03/01/19 **OSAC (Oregon Student Assistance Commission) Scholarships.** Over 300 scholarships available to Oregon students. Each scholarship has its own criteria. Students can apply to 12 scholarships on one common application form. **Apply by Feb. 15, 2019 and be eligible for a \$500 Early Bird Scholarship.** Note: You cannot submit this application until your 1st semester grades of your senior year are posted (around Jan. 5). Final deadline to submit OSAC application is March 1, 2018 (5:00pm). Apply online at www.GetCollegeFunds.org
- 03/01/19 **The Seneca Scholarship. One \$10,000 scholarship, one \$7,000 scholarship, and one \$5,000 scholarship.** Based only on an outstanding essay that shows a true understanding for Oregon's timberlands. Essay should be 5 – 7 pages in length. You must hold three in-person interviews with people who are connected to the Natural Resource Industry. The essay should be themed around, but not limited to: "What are the benefits of active forest management to the forest and to the community?" The application is facilitated through the **OSAC (Oregon Student Assistance Commission) Scholarships.**
- 03/01/19 **Eastern Oregon University Scholarships.** For undocumented students. EOU is partnering with [The Dream.US](http://TheDream.US). For first time college students or community college graduates who intend to enroll at EOU.
- 03/01/19 **Portland Community College Future Connect Scholarship.** Open to first generation college students. The Future Connect Scholarship Program will provide financial and academic support throughout your PCC experience (up to three years). Every scholar receives \$600 - \$3400 a year. Must submit one essay. Priority deadline is January 31. www.pcc.edu/futureconnect
- 03/01/19 (updated)** **Black United Fund of Oregon Scholarships.** Four different categories of scholarships awarded. GPA ranges from 3.50 or higher – 2.75. For seniors of African/African American descent. Based on recommendations, resume, grades. Scholarships available for: Concordia University, George Fox University, Lewis & Clark College, University of Portland, and Willamette University. Must complete the Common Application in order to be eligible for one of the college scholarships. Details available at www.bufor.org

- 03/01/19 **Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. Scholarship.** For African American seniors with a minimum 3.00 GPA planning to attend a four-year college or university. Requires essay, teacher and counselor recommendations.

- 03/04/19 **Greenfield Peace Writing Scholarship.** The Physicians for Social Responsibility annual scholarship contest. \$1,000, \$750, or \$500 prize for 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place. Open to all seniors and juniors. You must submit an essay, narrative or poem on “How can you work against systemic racism to help make our world more healthy and peaceful?” 600 word maximum. Research information and entry forms available at www.oregonpsr.org
- 05/17/19 **Oregon Chinese Consolidated Benevolent Association Scholarship. \$500 - \$3,000 scholarships.** Criteria includes: at least 50% Chinese ethnicity; gpa 2.75 or above; school and community activities; essay. Application available at www.oregonccba.org
