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Community

The William S. Hart Union High School District is located in Northern Los Angeles County and serves the entire Santa Clarita Valley. It is the third largest city in Los Angeles County and the 18th largest city in the state of California, with a population of 213, 321. Learning Post’s diverse student population reflects the demographics of the greater Santa Clarita Valley. There are roughly 23,000 students enrolled in the district’s public schools and programs, which include seven high schools, six junior high schools, a continuation school, an independent study school, an adult school, a middle-college high school and a career-to-education program.

School

Learning Post High School prepares students to meet challenges of the future as lifelong learners and responsible citizens by providing an alternative learning environment. The staff, in partnership with parents and the community, provides the structure and challenges from which students can reach their highest potential and develop the knowledge, skills and character necessary to succeed. We emphasize self-respect, respect for others, fairness, and the responsibility for one’s actions.

The academic program is organized as an independent learning environment. Independent study students are self-motivated and capable of working on their own with minimal direct instruction. Reasons students choose independent study varies. From highly motivated students who would like to graduate early and begin college to students who are behind in credits. The reasons are as unique as our students. For over 30 years, Learning Post has assisted students in reaching their individual academic goals.

Learning Post High School graduates are required to complete a minimum of 230 credits, five for each semester class passed with a “D” or better. In addition, they are required to pass Algebra.
