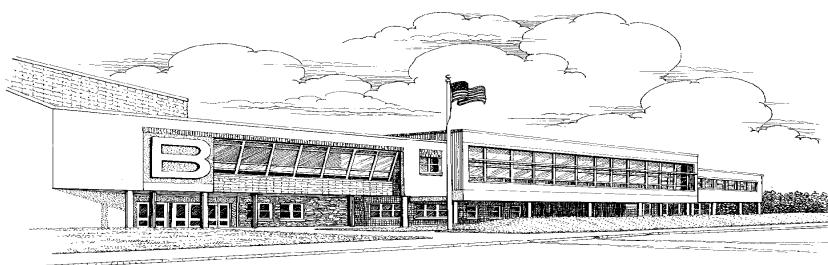

Alternative Programs

2+2 Program

Qualified juniors are eligible to enroll in college courses at Rowan College at Burlington County to earn their High School diploma and an Associates Degree simultaneously.

3+1 Program

Qualified seniors are eligible to enroll in college courses at Rowan College at Burlington County to earn college credits and high school credits simultaneously.

Middle College Program with Fairleigh Dickinson University

In affiliation with Fairleigh Dickinson University, students can earn college credits in the following select courses: AP English 12, AP Calculus, AP History, Chemistry I, Chemistry II Honors, Physics II Honors, Spanish V Honors, Genocide, Creative Writing.

RCBC College Acceleration Program

In affiliation with Rowan College at Burlington County, students can earn college credits in the following select courses: General Psychology, AP English 12, AP Calculus, AP Statistics, AP Biology, AP Physics, AP Chemistry, Chemistry II Honors, Honors Biology, AP Computer Science A, Spanish V Honors, AP Art IV, Engineering, Design & Technology.
