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**COMMUNITY**- Shelbyville is a city in Addison Township, Shelby County, Indiana. Shelbyville is located approximately 26 miles southeast of Indianapolis near the I-74 / IN-9 interchange. It is a growing community of nearly 18,000 that takes great pride in the fact that they have maintained a friendly "small town" atmosphere. The city of Shelbyville offers safe neighborhoods, beautiful parks, and unique shops and businesses. The school serves a suburban community with a diversified industrial characteristic. **SCHOOL DISTRICT** - Shelbyville Central Schools is accredited by the Indiana Department of Education and is comprised of over 4,000 students. The school district consists of one high school (grades 9-12), one alternative school (grades 11-12), one middle school (grades 6-8) and three elementary schools (grades PK-5). The school system is affiliated with the Blue River Career Program. The district's state-assistance enrollment is approximately 46%. The SHS state-assistance enrollment is 39%. Shelbyville Central Schools received an "A" from the Indiana Department of Education. Shelbyville High School also received an "A," was named a Four-Star School, and was a U.S. News & World Report Best High Schools Bronze Medal recipient.

**CALENDAR/SCHEDULE** - The school year consists of two semesters, and each semester is comprised of two nine-week grading periods. Students attend seven 50-minute classes daily. College and military representatives are encouraged to schedule visits during school hours.

## GRADING INFORMATION

Shelbyville High School follows the requirements outlined by the Indiana Department of Education for the General, Core 40, Core 40 with Academic Honors, and Core 40 with Technical Honors diplomas. All students are also required to complete Preparing for College and Careers and a Technology course.

### AUDIT POLICY

Students may audit a course they have already completed and earned credit for; however, they cannot earn credit twice for the same course. When auditing a course, the student will be expected to participate fully and to complete all assignments, tests, and course requirements. After completing the audited course, the letter grades received in both courses will appear on the student's permanent transcript. Credit will be granted for the audited course and the grade earned will be included in the cumulative GPA calculation; however, the credit earned for the original course will be eliminated and the grade excluded from the GPA. Additionally, if the student previously earned an extra index point for completing seven courses in the semester in which the original course was completed, the extra index point will be removed from the GPA calculation.

### COMPENSATION FOR SEVEN CLASSES

For each semester that a student successfully completes seven classes, one point will be added to the total quality points before the GPA is calculated by dividing by the number of credits attempted. This will compensate students who wish to take a class in lieu of a study hall. The class must be taken at SHS during the semester it is counted.

### CLASS RANK & GPA CALCULATIONS

Rank in class is calculated at the end of the first semester of the freshman year and each semester thereafter. All classes are calculated into the ranking. Rank is cumulative and includes transfer grades. Advanced placement courses and some dual credit courses are weighted to encourage students to challenge themselves. These courses will receive an extra quality point in figuring the GPA and class rank. Weighted grades from other schools are not transferred.
