



Acacia School Parent Tips

The following Parent Tips are meant to encourage a safe and orderly environment. We hope you find them helpful.

General:

- We welcome parents visiting our school. Please always sign in and get a visitor's sticker in our office, even if you are just dropping off something.
- To avoid distractions to the children, we ask that you move to the front of the school away from the classrooms in the morning at 8:00am when children start instruction. At the end of the day, we ask that you wait until 2:25pm to enter school grounds on the playground side and wait until 12:30pm on Wednesdays.
- For safety and liability, younger siblings of students are not allowed on the play equipment during the school day.
- Dogs are never allowed on school grounds. This is a city and county law. Additionally, we have children who are highly allergic to dogs and some who are very afraid of them.

Parking/Pick-up and Drop-off Procedures

- Please do not ever leave your car unattended in the parking lot along the red curb. This is a drive-through pick up and drop off area only.
- There is very little parking in our parking lot. It is best to find parking on one of the side streets when visiting the school.
- There is no parking at any time on the east side of Acacia in front of our school. From Dorothy to the first driveway, it is a right hand turn lane into the school. After the first driveway, it is all red. Parents can be ticketed if they park along Acacia in the red zone.
- To drop off or pick up your child, pull into the parking lot and pull as far forward as possible. We will assist children getting into or out of vehicles. Children are loaded into cars and unloaded by the flagpole or further to the front of the car line.
- For drop off, make sure children are prepared to exit the car quickly and for safety always have them exit from the right side of the car (not the driver's side).
- Use the crosswalks at all times especially on Dorothy because walking in the middle of the street is dangerous and you put the safety of your children at risk.
