The Board has been purposeful in setting up the fund. We are required by law to have a 3% reserve. Fund 17 establishes a ceiling and that is the amount we will keep in reserve. Mr. Elbling speaking for himself said we owe it to our employees to make sure we can pay if there is an earthquake, a catastrophic fire or whatever it may be. It says in there it is not for payroll necessarily, but if we had to tighten our belts for a couple months while waiting for a check from the State we want to pay salaries. Regardless, it is a ceiling and there are Districts out there with 20, 22, 23 percent reserve. He made a commitment to say that it will always be intolerable to him to have a huge reserve of that size. We will never keep in reserve more than what the Board established which is two months of payroll. Thanked everyone for everything they do. Spoke about appreciation weeks and how they have all his appreciation, whether they are classified or certificated, grounds or in the office. Wished everyone a good summer.

Comments of Mr. Urteaga

Comments of CSEA

CSEA COMMENTS

Michelle Ruiz, President of CSEA congratulated all the Employees who were honored. CSEA appreciates all the hard work they have done over so many years. Thanked the Board members for attending the CSEA member recognition banquet. It was a great event for Christine Montgomery who has been with the District for many years. Michelle thanked the District for working with CSEA in coming to an agreement on benefits. It goes a long way. CSEA will meet next week to ratify the agreement. Spoke about training and how important it is. For classified employees who do not get a whole lot. There are about 540 classified employees and over ½ of those are directly working with students all of the time. They are the support for many of the teachers and they don't get the training that they need, they don't get the same opportunities that they need. She would like to work with the District on getting additional training days and see the District working and talking with CSEA leadership and what those professional development needs are. CSEA has a lot of information and a lot of different opportunities with the association that they can offer also. Would like the Board to be proactive because it will only benefit everyone and all students.

Comments of EWEA

EWEA COMMENTS

Missy Michaud, President of EWEA spoke about CSEA and training. The training opportunities that they have gotten, the feedback from the CSEA folks is that it is amazing and the feedback from the teachers is it is amazing because it gives everybody the same lingo and puts them in a position of having an

understanding. It shows that you respect them enough to get them trained. EWEA will do anything they can to help with training. Thanked the Board for attending the retirement tea. There were almost 2,000 combined years of East Whittier teaching experience. Thanked Melissa Torres for putting it together and Jennifer Macias who helped as well. Food Services did an absolutely amazing job. Thanked the Board for agreeing to an MOU for insurance. She knows that it was not something that they truly wanted to do. They also know that the time was limited and they appreciate the work that was done at the bargaining table to agree to write an MOU to cover the \$16,500 for the insurance again. They appreciate that. Staff at the meeting are there to support the bargaining team who are at the table proposing SPED language. Everybody knows how SPED affects every single kid in the District and every single teacher. The teachers are in attendance even though they felt there was some retaliation on the TTD. They met at the meeting on a Monday and the following Friday was a TTD and for the first time in her career the time was moved up a ½ hour. It is not against contract language to have folks there from 7:30 to 3:15 on a non student day, but for those folks there student day starts at a different time so it was very inconvenient. She and Superintendent Patterson were talking about one of the TTD presentations and how it was a great day. Even though the teachers present know that something will come back and bite them they are at the meeting anyway because it is important and the SPED language is important. She heard a rumor that EWEA was responsible for Asst. Superintendent Dr. Staine leaving. They find that flattering but they also don't understand how that can be true. If EWEA is complaining about it being more important to test than teach than that person should be submitting a resignation. When they are being told that their SPED kids are secondary to the Gen Ed kids by the way they are treated inside the classroom as well as outside the classroom that should be someone who is submitting a resignation. Clearly the SPED teachers the way they are being treated, abusing them, overstaffing caseloads and then saying it is the teachers fault, those are positions that shouldn't be filled by the people that are filling them. EWEA does not want anyone to leave that is not a solution. It is the same person but it is not the solution. The only way to solve the SPED issue is by working together. Teachers are smart people. The bargaining team presented the District with some SPED language and it is fabulous. They would like to have a conversation over the language. They crafted it, put it together using samples from others in the United States. It needs to be worked but it needs to be worked on as a team. Everyone needs

to be creative with their thinking and purposeful on the money spending. These things have to be done together. Releasing all the SPED teachers every year so they don't complain is not how we make a program. There are direct requests being made by the bargaining department towards ESS regarding specific things and they need help with those things. These things need to be answered when the bargaining chair asks for information. There is an expectation that the information will be provided. SPED language because it does affect everyone is a deal breaker. She thinks it is important to make sure the Board understands that SPED is important to everyone not just the SPED department. Spoke about jobs being created and how EWEA feels it is fantastic to have jobs created, however they do think the created jobs need to be those that work directly with students. A job is being created to pick up what a director does. If you hire two of those you have two classroom teachers who could maybe bring down the caseload caps on the SPED kids to make it so they can learn in an environment that is conducive. Class sizes need to be brought down and not brought up and to suggest bringing them up is truly insulting and is a slap in the face to everyone in the room, who have enormous class sizes that are not conducive to student learning. The language they are looking at is not a dollar value it is maybe half and half, but they need to take parts of it and put it in practice. Something needs to be done to retain teachers and so that we can do what we are obligated to do for students and that is truly teach the students in the environment that is best suited to their needs. Spoke about sports. In the audience at the last board meeting it was asked why the conversation was taking place and she shared with people that it was because everyone has a practice that they follow. What they followed was one side of the paper is an application where the parent signature goes and the other side is grade check, so that part happens with what is going on in the class. The kid makes sports and a grade check is iffy well everyone does not get thrown out. You should get to play sports but there has to be an agreement. Generally something like that is the kid has an academic responsibility to the end of the season. That is done but that was challenged this year and it was challenged in such a way that it exploded into a mess that ended up with discipline for a teacher because the teacher was trying to report at the academic teachers request why is the kid playing. All they want is for the same practice to be followed at all 3 middle schools, however they can't follow the practice if it is not supported in writing. Their behavior has to be monitored. They should not get to play if they have inappropriate classroom behavior. Athletics is a privilege of academics. They are not

asking for kids to be eliminated from playing sports they are asking for something in writing to put them on a plan to help them become better students and athletes.

Comments of the Superintendent

Mr. Patterson spoke about the many events that he has been attending some of which were mentioned by Trustees. He also spoke about attending the School Office Coordinator and Secretary luncheon. It was a wonderful event. Attended the ACSA awards ceremony honoring Mrs. Tavitian, Mr. Mayernik and Mr. Muetzel who received administrator awards. Mentioned that Ceres opened their salad bar and that now all elementary schools have a salad bar. The District is looking for something to do similar at the middle schools next year. The student leadership event at Parnell Park was amazing. There were about 75 student leaders whether it was ASB at the middle school or student council at the elementary school. The student event was to clean up at the park and take care of some of the animals within the zoo. This is another example of the amazing student body that we have and their understanding of it is more about not just what they do at their school but what they can provide to the community as well. Mr. Patterson mentioned that he liked that the Annie play was a dress rehearsal for the Mrs. Hannigan and Annie in the video, it seems they have multiple talents because they were very engaging in the video as well.




