<p>Provide high-quality project-based curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows: All classroom teachers will be provided with and trained in research-based strategies that will lead to high-quality instruction. In addition, the classroom teachers will follow a standards-based program that is driven by the district instructional guides and interim assessments in order to improve instruction and plan objectives for future professional development sessions.</p>	<p>Promote and monitor attendance When absent send a note with your child indicating the reason for the absence and make sure all assignments are returned in a timely manner following the absence.</p>
<p>Hold parent-teacher conferences during which the compact will be discussed as it relates to the individuals child's achievement. Specifically, parent conferences will be held over a two-day period in both the Fall and the Spring semester.</p>	<p>Monitor homework, classwork, assessments, and upcoming school events via Schoology. Sign up for access to the LAUSD Parent Passport so you can access Schoology and other pertinent information about your child. Check Schoology on a regular basis for homework assignments, projects, and upcoming assessments and events.</p>
<p>Provide parents with frequent reports on their child's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows: An academic report card will be issued for each child at the end of the Fall and the end of the Spring semesters. In addition, at least three progress report cards will be sent home prior to the final report card. Wright MS will also use Schoology and Blackboard Connect to communicate with families about their children's progress.</p>	<p>Set goals with your student at the beginning of each semester and evaluate these goals every five weeks.</p>
<p>Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows: During assigned conference periods, teachers will be available to meet with parents to discuss individual student progress. Those teachers who do not have an assigned conference period will be available to meet with parents before or after school. In all situations, it is best to call ahead and schedule an appointment to meet with all school staff.</p>	<p>Communicate with teachers and school staff about your child's needs and strengths. During assigned conference periods, teachers will be available to meet with parents to discuss individual student progress. Those teachers who do not have an assigned conference period will be available to meet with parents before or after school.</p>
<p>Provide parents with opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows: To observe one of your child's classes, it is best but not required to let the teacher know in advance. Once you arrive at the school you must check-in at the main office where you will receive the guidelines for parent/guardian classroom observations. To Volunteer or participate in classroom activities parents will need to contact the individual teacher to let them know that you are available and would like to do so. Wright Middle School STEAM Magnet staff, faculty, and parents of Title 1 eligible students met to develop this policy and will meet annually to update this policy to reflect the changing needs of parents and the school.

POLICY INVOLVEMENT

Wright Middle School STEAM Magnet will hold an annual meeting, which will be open to the parents of all Title 1 eligible students. This meeting will inform parents of the school's participation in Title 1, the parent's rights associated with being involved at a Title 1 school and the requirements that the school must meet in order to stay compliant. In addition to this annual meeting, all parents will receive an initial letter informing them their child is eligible to be served with Title 1 funds and programs, timely information about programs being developed and implemented, and annual update of strategies, curriculum, and assessments being used to help their child access.

As a Title 1 school we will elect a School Site Council which will meet at least 6 times a year at various times in order to meet the needs of and encourage the involvement of all parents. It will be the responsibility of this council to plan, review and make improvements upon the parent involvement policy and the single plan. In addition to this organized and formal council, parents will also be given various opportunities throughout the year to attend parent training workshops or parent conferences.
