Your child recently took a STAAR assessment during the 2017-2018 school year.

Results from the assessment will be available online beginning in mid June. When scores are available, a notice will be posted on the MISD webpage and shared through MISD social media. You may review your child's scores, as well as additional information relating to your child's performance, by going to:

If you know your child's unique access code, enter the unique access code along with your child's birthday and click **"Log in to Student Portal"**.

If you do not know your child's unique access code, click on **"Find My Unique Student Access Code"**. Type the information required to get the unique access code for your child (first name, Social Security number or State ID number, and date of birth). Click **"Go"** and an access code will appear. Then log into the site using the code. Please keep this access code in a safe place as it can be used to access all future STAAR assessment results for your child.
