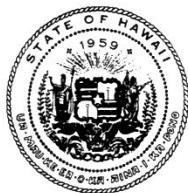

Dear Mililani High School Parents and Guardians,

Our administration was made aware of a social media post warning of a school threat. The post showed graffiti and warned of a threat. The threat was evaluated by HPD and the School Safety Branch of the DOE. It also has been forwarded to the FBI for further review. It was determined that there is no imminent threat to our campus and our school will remain open on normal schedules. We will however have increased police presence on and around campus tomorrow, April 30, 2019.

We are sending a letter home to inform you of this situation and to ask for your help regarding the circulation of social media posts. I urge all students and families to refrain from reposting threats and rumors online.

According to police, reposting a threat is as good as making the threat itself and contributes to prolonging the event. We encourage parents to speak with their child about making the right choices and the potential consequences of their actions.

All threats to our school or students are taken very seriously and are investigated thoroughly. Terroristic threats are considered Class A student conduct offenses. Penalties can range from detention to dismissal with the possibility of arrest and serious criminal charges.
