CONSULTING SERVICES – EMK

Board approval is being requested for Ethel McKnight Elementary School's literacy consultant, Mara Trager. Mrs. Trager is scheduled to provide a total of 21 professional development sessions (three full day visits a month from November-May) for teachers in grades K-5. Mrs. Trager will be paid through Title 1 funds allocated to the McKnight School for the 2016-17 school year. The cost of each PD session will be \$2,000 with a total cost of services equaling \$42,000 (see attached service contract). The goal of the consultant's work with staff members at EMK will be to help staff improve small group literacy instruction.

Mara Trager, LLC Consultant \$2,000 per session/21 sessions (Not to exceed \$42,000.)

Mathematics

- 1) **Skills & Content Support**: Students who are struggling on grade level readiness for on-level Mathematics courses.
- 2) **Extended Response Focused Training**: Students who scored as partially meeting or approaching expectations on PARCC 2016 will be invited to this afterschool program.
- 3) Algebra Readiness: 8th grade students in Course 3 will be invited to this afterschool program.
 - Rationale for Mathematics programs:
- 1) The goal will be raise student's grade level readiness as measured by STAR Math and PARCC Math.
- 2) The goal of this program will be to increase the student's ability to focus on multi- step mathematics problems as measured on PARCC 2017.
- 3) The goal is to increase students' Algebra readiness so that they may find success in HS Algebra.

English Language Arts

Content Literacy & Strategies Support: Support for students struggling to meet grade level proficiency in general education program. Focus on content literacy and strategies to support successful integration. Evidence Tables targets: Address learning gaps in identified population through prescriptive lessons and instruction designed to support students in thinking through tasks and analyzing reading and writing for deeper understanding. Push in literacy support: Teachers will push into SS/Science classes to support content literacy (frontloading content, content multi-model, pre-teaching high frequency and Tier 3 vocabulary, discussions using content, engaging in reading strategy work, graphically organizing content).

• Rationale for ELA programs:

The goal of each of these programs is to support a successful integration into the grade level content and skills.

The SBA is recommending approval of BoardDocs Pro for paperless agenda management per the attached proposal and resolution.

Whereas, it is in the best interest of the District to move forward and utilize current available web based software for the creation of a paperless and readily available Board of Education agenda and supportive documents including policies and contracts; and

Whereas, the company BoardDocs Pro is a state-of-the-art cloud based Board document management service developed specifically for public governing bodies and endorsed by the NJ School Boards Association for such services;

Therefore be it Resolved, that the EWRSD Board of Education approves the appointment of BoardDocs Pro as the District web based Board document system and authorizes the SBA to move forward with the engagement of their services.
