

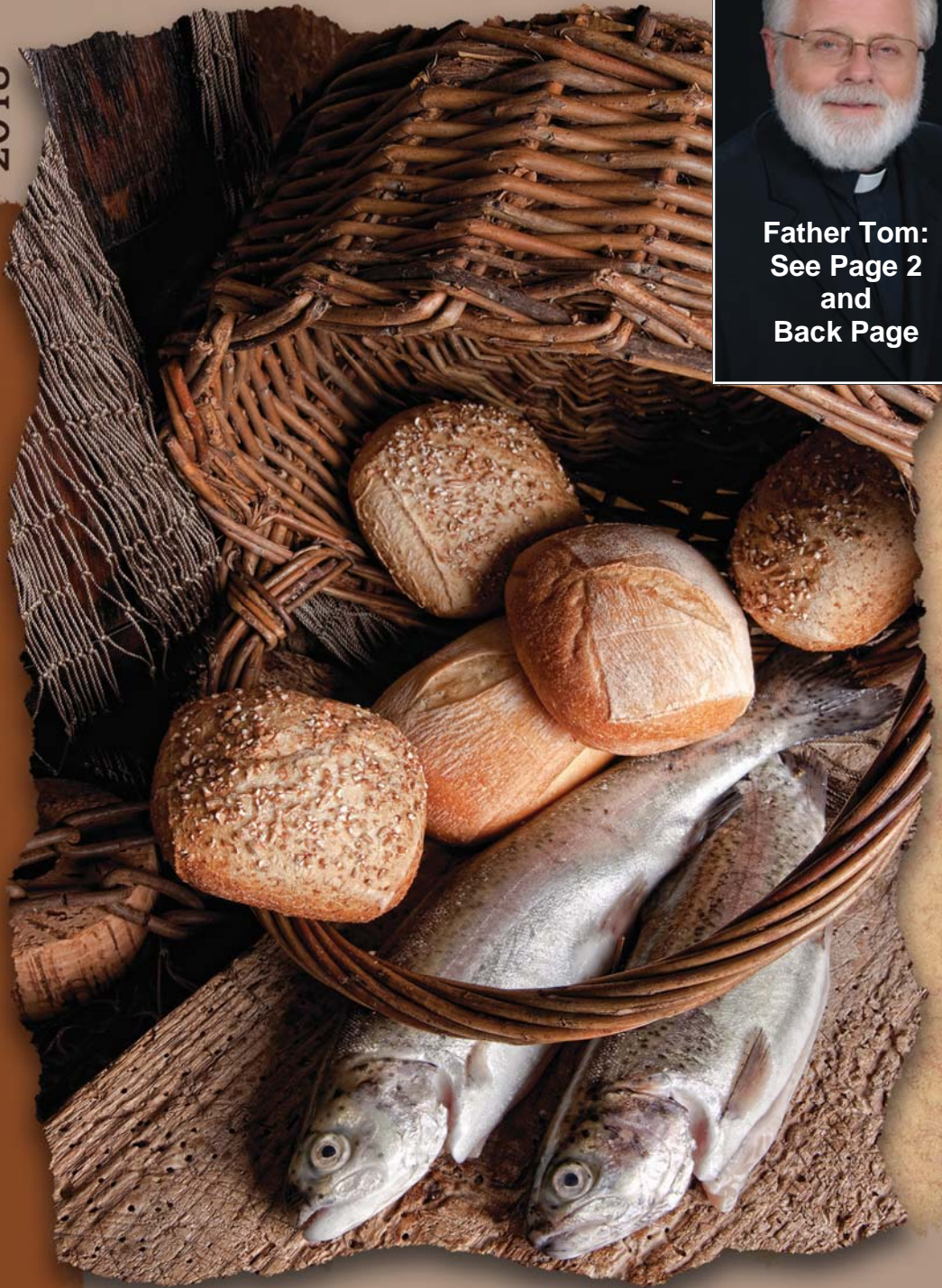

2 Father Tom's insight into ministry

Jesus and his 12 apostles tried to get away to a deserted place, and the people followed him... "a great multitude," and Jesus said they were like sheep without a shepherd. Even though we need to get away and refresh ourselves, there are people who are hungry, who don't even know what they are hungry for, but they need to be taught, they need to be fed with the Word of God. Quite honestly, that sometimes is presented as a model for the way that *priests* should dedicate themselves to their people and their relationship of teaching, shepherding and of sanctifying. But I never found that to be true. And the reason is that you, too, are shepherds. You, too, are sanctified. You, too, influence and lead one another within the Church.

So I've always come to feel that in teaching and in preaching, I am more like a fellow speaker sharing with colleagues along the way that we are walking together – fellow pilgrims. Because you are members of the Body of Christ, you are baptized into Christ, sharing his life and confirmed with his spirit, sharing his ministry. Your mission is to the world, to one another, and to me.

One of the things that I have felt so very special, in my precious 15 years that I spent with you, was the quality in the way that you ministered to me. For that, I simply want to thank you... We talk a lot about ministry, in fact, in the days before the Second Vatican Council, "ministers" were leading Protestant congregations. Now we call one another ministers in many ways, and many have a particular role and responsibility that is called a ministry. OLA has always been famous for bringing that charism of working in the Lord's vineyard from among all of our people, all of you, members of the Body of Christ.

What was very frightening for me long before I actually came to OLA, but it has governed my understanding throughout my whole priestly ministry, is taking apart the word ministry. You may remember I always loved to play with words. When you take apart the word ministry, you have two Latin words: one is one is obvious and the other is not quite so obvious. It begins with the prefix "mini" and we know what mini means, it means "small." But the second part is from the Latin word that means "to stand." So to "stand small" is the meaning of ministry. Ministry is not doing something for people, not even doing something good and holy for the People of God. Ministry is entering into a relationship with those whom you serve, and that relationship is one of standing small. A couple of things important to understand: standing small is not a put down, standing small does not mean being in a position of inferiority. Standing small means being in a position that lifts up the other.

The other thing that we need to understand about ministry, standing small, is that you are *standing*. You have to have a good self image, a healthy self identity. To be a minister, you have to know who you are and, as I said earlier, *whose* you are. If we are members of the Body of Christ, we belong to him, as St. Paul reminds us in the Second Reading. Therefore we are able to stand with confidence, but "stand small" in a way that fills up the other.

Now, one of the things that Msgr. Barry told me, when I became his successor here, was a story about the time that he came to OLA. As with any transition and with any new pastor, he had difficulty here. I certainly experienced the reality that I was *not* Msgr. Barry, and Fr. Charles has experienced the reality that he is *not* Fr. Tom. Sometimes that's expressed very negatively, too. Msgr. Barry, when he first came, experienced the fact that he was not Fr. Strange, and there was controversy, as some of you may recall that far back. What you may not know, he told me that he went to see Fr. Donald Strange, and he described what was happening. The people did not seem to accept him, he said. Fr. Strange said to Msgr. Barry, "Bill, there's only one thing... you have to *love* your people. And further, hand in hand, you have to *tell* them that you love them. You may think that you are showing love by your faithfulness in ministry and all of that, but you do have to tell." You may have noticed that in every letter I wrote, I always ended with "I love you." That was more of a reminder to me than to you, that in everything I'd done and given, I would try to fulfill that love. Love, as we know, is entering into a relationship in which those who are in love are primarily concerned with building up the other person. So isn't love fulfilled in ministry? Isn't ministry primarily the meaning of love?

All of this comes to my mind in the readings that we had, wonderful ones about shepherds and nourishing the flock. We need to realize that nobody gets nourished unless we are nourishing one another. And one of the things that I felt during my 15 years here, and continue to feel, is the depth and the quality of your ministry. It's really very obvious that whatever that stuff in the air may have been in the transition to Fr. Charles, you have continued that with him, in building him up and allowing him to build you up, so that we may build up one another. So you've been good. God bless you and thank you so much.! – *Msgr. Tom Welbers 50th anniversary homily at OLA*

JustAct is a ministry that provides opportunities for education, spiritual growth and action in service to others based on the Church's social teachings. WHAT IS GOOD NEWS PEOPLE?

This program is a dynamic, parish-wide, faith formation program for adults. It offers an introduction to Catholic Social Teaching in a shorter format: 7 weeks in fall and 7 weeks in spring. The goals of Good News People are to explore the call to discipleship and the power of community through prayer, reflection, and action, and find renewed hope in living the Gospel and putting faith into action;

WHAT IS JUSTFAITH?

JustFaith is an extended justice education process that meets weekly, employing books, videos, guest speakers, discussion, prayer, retreats and hands-on experiences. This is a 30-week formation process. There are two retreats – one to open and one to close the program. Four dates are dedicated to group projects.

It focuses on the practical challenges of following Jesus into the broken heart of our world, inspired by the urgency and spirit of the Gospel message to our lives, to our relationships, and to our times. Participants practice "the undivided life" of Christian discipleship—engaging in contemplation while immersing ourselves in the heart of our fragmented world. This is a 20-week program.

Tradiciones de Nuestra Fe

El día 2 de agosto es la fiesta de Santa María de los Ángeles, patrona de Costa Rica y de los franciscanos. En 1635 la mestiza Juana Pereira descubrió una pequeña imagen de María con el Niño Dios. Varias veces la imagen se le perdió y regresaba al sitio donde la había encontrado el día 2 de agosto. Por esta razón el lugar a donde regresaba se convirtió en su santuario y se le dio el título de Nuestra Señora de los Ángeles en honor de la capilla dedicada a Santa María de los Ángeles afuera del pueblito de Asís en Italia.

Esta capillita reconocida como la Porciúncula fue restaurada por san Francisco. Allí nació la familia franciscana y Francisco insistió que los frailes nunca abandonaran ese lugar porque era consagrado a Dios. Allí María y los ángeles alababan a Dios cuando los seres humanos habían dejado de hacerlo.

Según parece, la imagen costarricense también insistió en quedarse en un pedacito de tierra consagrado a Dios donde sus hijos e hijas pueden recurrir a ella y adorar al Dios eterno.
