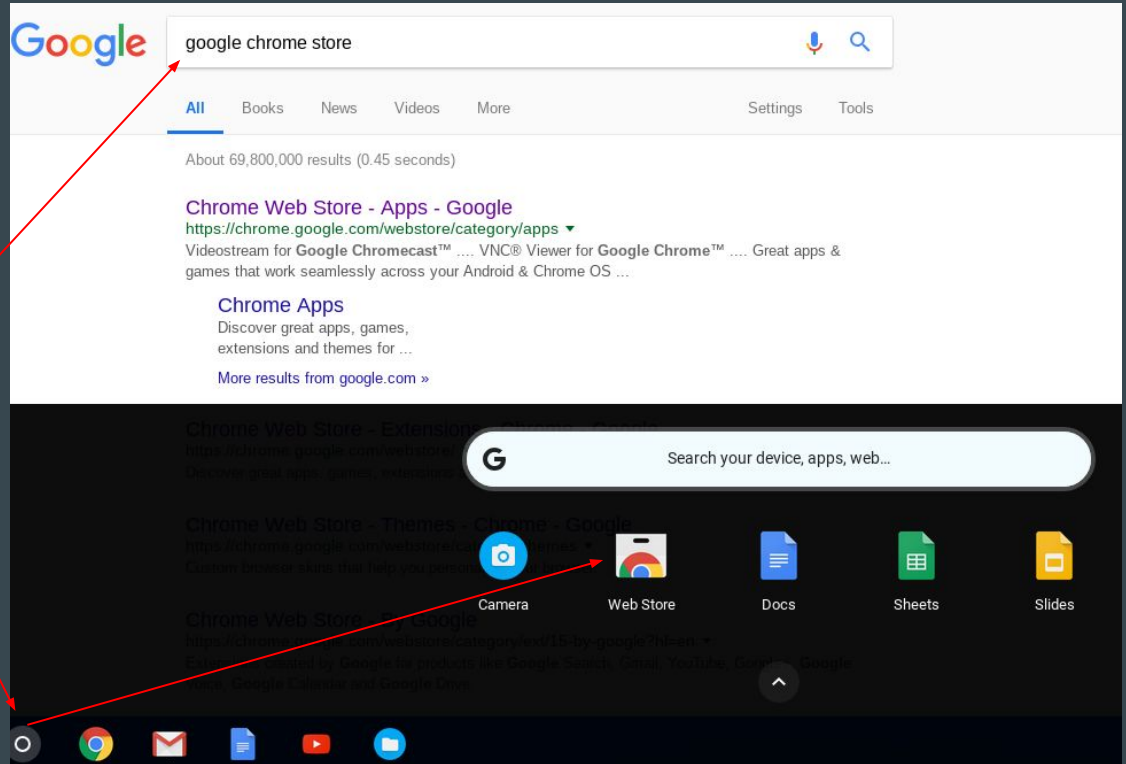

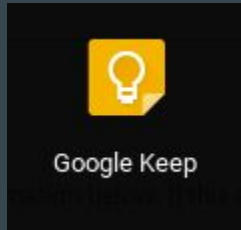

GOAL 1: Access the Chrome store

- Search for 'google chrome store'
- Use the chromebook menu



GOAL 2: Explain the definition of apps & extensions



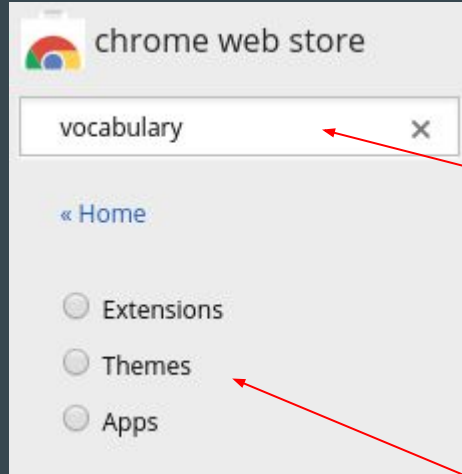
An app is a specialized program that often provides a specific function. For example, Google Keep can be used for note-taking.



An extension allows you to add new features to your browser. For example, Save to Google Drive lets you save any file or image from the internet directly to your Drive.

Remember, you are responsible for any extensions and apps that you install.
All must adhere to the Acceptable Use Technology Agreement.


GOAL 3: Search for relevant apps and extensions



To search for relevant apps and extensions in the Chrome store:

- Type the category of app or extension you are looking for. For example, if you know you could use help learning vocabulary, type in “Vocabulary.”
- If you know the name of the app or extension you want, you also can just type that.
- Select the results you would like by choosing Extensions or Apps.

GOAL 4: Add Apps & Extensions

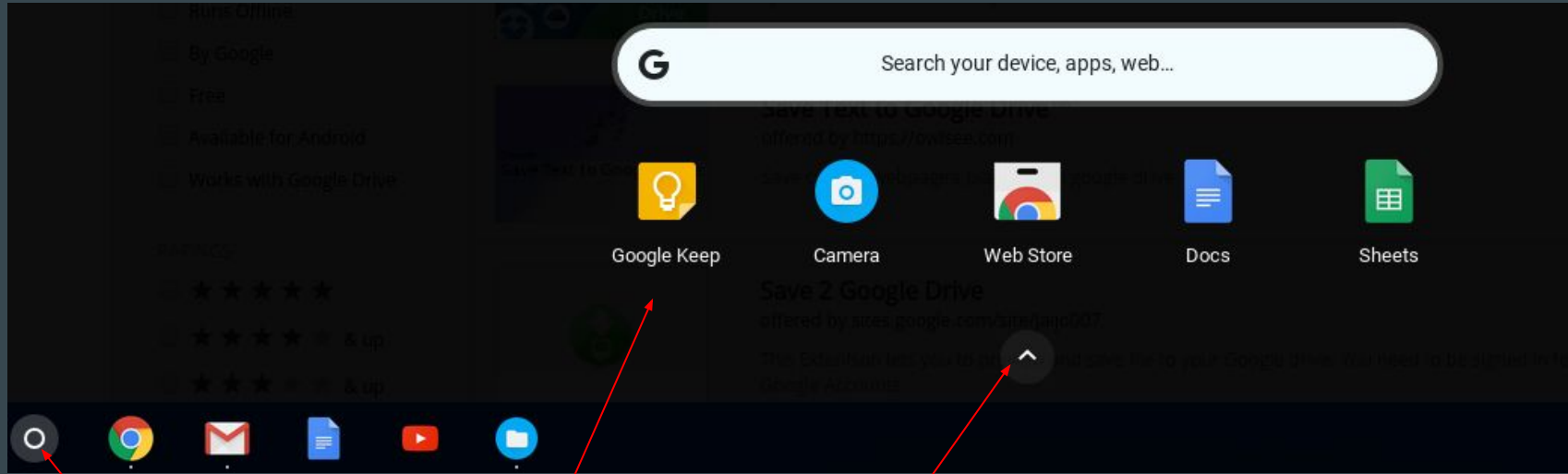

After you review your search results and have found the desired apps or extension

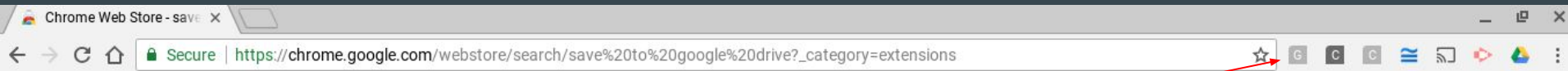
- Click blue +ADD TO CHROME button

GOAL 5: Access and use apps



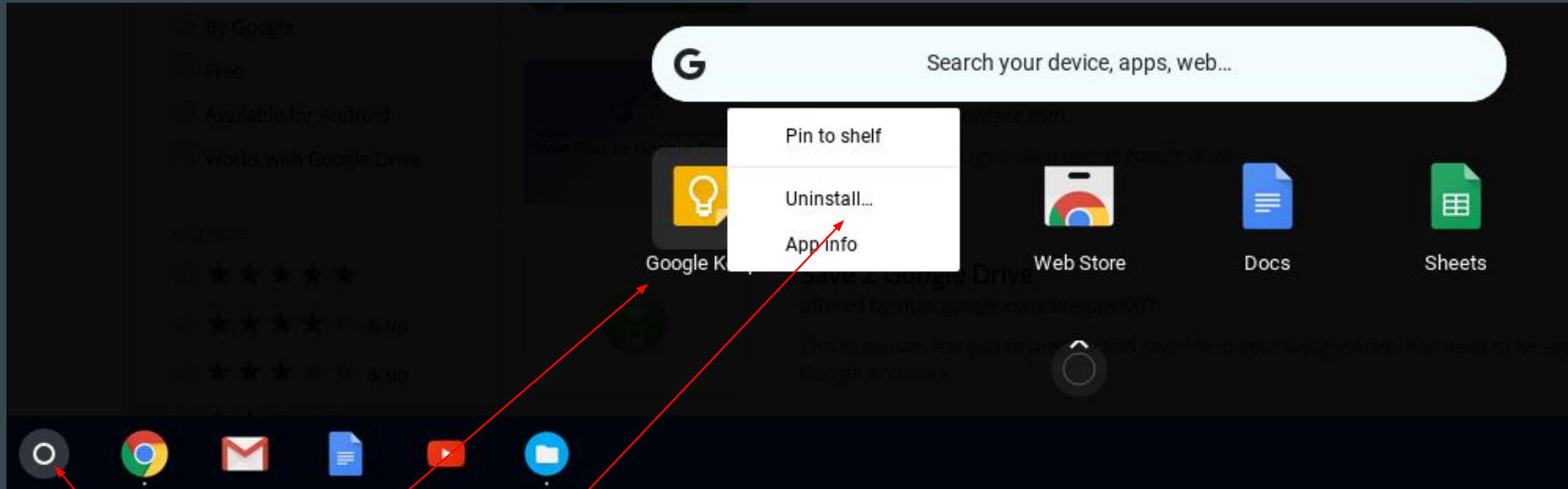
- Open the chromebook menu.
- Select the desired app.
- If it does not appear, expand the screen.

GOAL 5: Access and use extensions



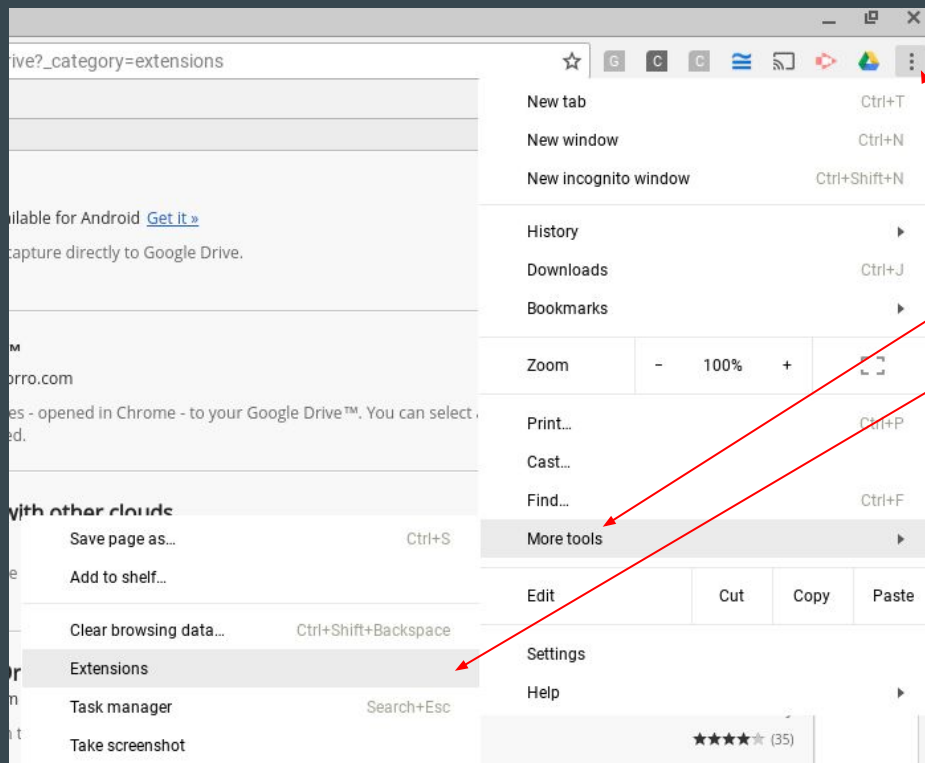
- Your extensions appear on your Chrome toolbar.
- Whenever you want to use one, click on the appropriate extension icon.
- For example, if you click the Save to Google Drive extension, the web page you are on will be saved to your Google Drive.

GOAL 6: Delete apps



- Open the chromebook menu.
- Right click on the app you would like to delete.
- Click Uninstall.
- Confirm by clicking Remove.

GOAL 6: Delete extensions



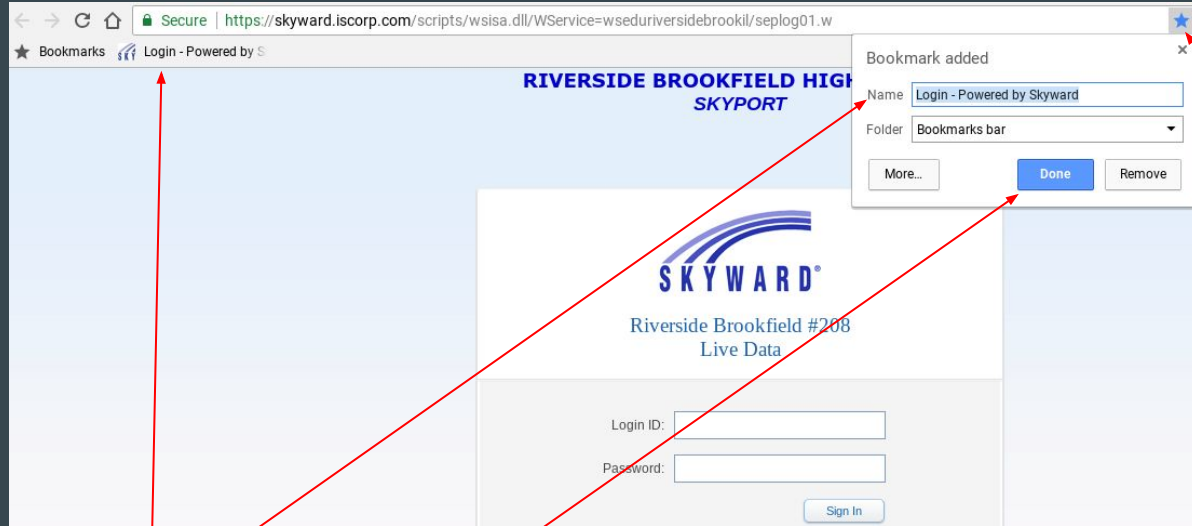
- Open the browser settings.
- Click More Tools.
- Click Extensions.
- Select Remove for the extension you would like to delete.

GOAL 8: Organize bookmarks

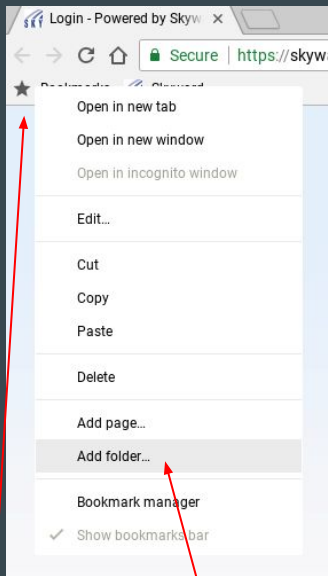


If you frequently use a site, you can bookmark it by clicking on the bookmark star.

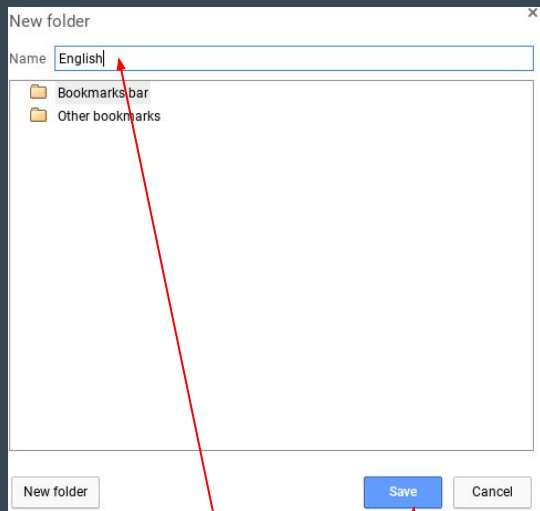
- Name the bookmark.
- Click Done.
- The new bookmark will appear on your bookmarks bar.

GOAL 9: Organize bookmarks

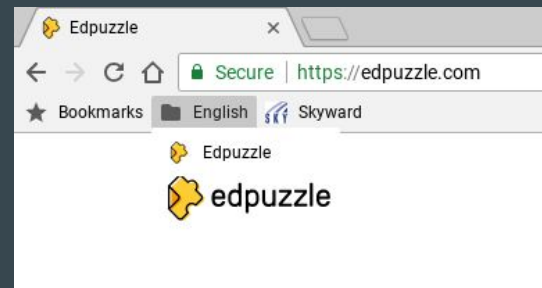
You also might want to organize your bookmarks by class.



Click on the Bookmarks star, then click Add folder.



Type the name of your class, then click Save.



Now you can access any bookmarks you add to that class folder.
