Faculty

At the heart of Judge Memorial are a faculty, staff, and administration who bring a faith commitment, depth of knowledge, generosity of time and talent, and personal caring to the learning environment. Our faculty, staff, coaches, and administration work tirelessly to build strong academic, performing arts, and athletic programs.

- There are 59 faculty members, 68% with advanced degrees.
- Teachers at Judge Memorial continue their own professional development through graduate courses, national conventions, and retreats.
- Many graduates of Judge return to serve as teachers, counselors, administrators, and coaches. In fact, 12% of our faculty are graduates of our school.

Faith and Christian Service

Judge Memorial prides itself on the presence of a strong Catholic identity. Prayer and reflection are an important part of each day. Judge Memorial assists students in their faith development and enrichment through both religious activities and academic study. Students develop and enhance their own personal faith by discovering themselves and their relationship with God through spiritual growth, moral development, and social justice. Christian service-learning is an integral part of the Judge experience as service hours are required all four years.

2018-2019 Honors and Advanced Placement Courses

Judge Memorial Catholic High School encourages all students to challenge themselves academically. Over 30 AP and Honors Courses are offered at Judge Memorial in disciplines such as art, English, music, social studies, mathematics, science, and world languages. Students who want the challenge of an AP course are accepted into Judge Memorial's Advanced Placement classes. Our testing policy is that all students enrolled in an AP class must take the AP examination. 75% of the Class of 2018 took AP exams, with 365 students overall taking 708 AP exams.

Class of 2019 Decile Ranking

Due to our competitive program and desire to keep students learning-oriented, it is our school policy not to assign class rank. An unweighted cumulative grade point average is computed at the end of the junior year and is derived from final grades of all coursework taken at Judge Memorial (or from a previous school if the student has transferred to Judge) except for summer courses.

The weighted GPA is used by Judge Memorial for awards only.

The cumulative overall grade point average is based on all grades received in ninth through twelfth grade. A distinction is made in assigning grade points for Honors and AP (Advanced Placement) courses. An honors course receives an extra half credit point added to the weighted GPA. An AP course receives an extra point added to the weighted GPA. The weighting of grades is used to bestow first honors awards at Baccalaureate/Graduation. Only core academic courses are averaged into the weighted GPA. The Valedictorian award is bestowed upon the senior who earned the highest academic weighted GPA. The Salutatorian award is bestowed upon the senior who earned the second highest academic weighted GPA.

Testing Statistics

The ACT is a national college admissions examination that consists of subject area tests in English, mathematics, reading, and science. The tool is designed to measure students' overall educational ability and their potential to complete college-level work. 90% of the Class of 2018 sat for the ACT test.

The National Merit Scholarship Program is an academic competition for recognition and scholarships that began in 1955. High school students enter the National Merit Program by taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. The nationwide pool of National Merit Semifinalists represent less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors.

College Attendance for the Class of 2018

- 170 students in the graduating Class of 2018.
- The Class of 2018 was awarded over \$18.6 million in scholarships and renewable grants.
- 98% of the Class of 2018 will continue their education in a postsecondary institution in the fall of 2018.
- 2% of the students were undeclared, going into the military, joining the workforce, or experiencing a gap year.
- 89% of the college-bound students are attending a 4-year college or university.
- 11% of the college-bound students are attending a 2-year college.
- 51% of the college-bound students are attending out-of-state institutions.
- 49% of the college-bound students are attending in-state institutions.
