Harvest Park Dress Code

Independent Study Information

Bike Rack/Skateboard Information

You **MUST** lock your skateboard in the bike rack using your lock and the specially designed skateboard holders. All bikes need to be locked up **INSIDE** the bike rack. Don't forget – always wear a helmet.

Cell Phone/Electronics Information

Patriots – please remember that all cell phones and ipods are to be turned off during school hours (that includes lunch periods and between classes). Ear buds are not to be showing. All electronics must be turned off and kept in your backpack. Cell phones cannot be used in the Library. They will be taken away if being used. Thank you.
