### **Trimming College Tuition**

You're happy your child wants to go to college- but concerned about how to finance it. These tips can help:

*-Earning college credits now can shave off a little college tuition. See if colleges on your teen's list accept AP or dual-enrollment credits. For example, a child who wants to go out of state may be better off taking AP courses if dual-enrollment credits only apply to in-state schools.*

*-Ask college financial aid offices about special circumstances. If other siblings will be in college at the same time or a parent is unemployed, your teen may qualify for additional aid. He or she could also look for targeted scholarships for students who have done community service or who have certain illnesses, for instance.*

*-Compare tuition, fees, and living expenses after he or she receives financial aid packages. That way, they will know the bottom line for each school. More expensive schools may offer more aid.*

### **A CAMPAIGN OF COMMUNITY SPIRIT BY THE A-TEAM AT RHS**




