NEWGULF ELEMENTARY

Pre-Kindergarten: February was a very busy month for Pre-Kindergarten students. The students predicted what the groundhog would do on February 2nd. They found many different shadows outside and compared the sizes and shapes of the shadows. Students watched their shadow follow them around on the playground. The students exchanged Valentines with their friends on Valentine's Day. President's Day was also discussed. The class is beginning their study of how plants and animals grow. There are only five letters left to learn this year. Students are also working on building sets of numbers from 0-10. The month will close with a lesson on Dental Health and proper teeth brushing. The students can't wait for Spring to arrive!

Kindergarten: February was a busy but fun month! We began the month by reading books and discussing ground-hog day. In math, we are learning to recognize coins and tell the value of each. We introduced addition and subtraction and have been practicing these skills daily. Reading is getting exciting! The children are reading in little readers and learning about blends while learning more sight words. We enjoyed decorating our Valentine bags and sharing cards with our friends at the Valentine party. In Social Studies, we discussed Martin Luther King and discussed President's Day. In Science, we learned about our four seasons and weather. We celebrated Dental Health Month by having Dr. Jennifer Kunkel from Needville Family Dentistry give a presentation on keeping our teeth healthy and clean!

1st Grade: Our first graders have been super busy these past few weeks. Our students have continued to accelerate in their reading and taking AR tests. We have finished up several Math and Science units. They have mastered number patterns and addition strategies, as well as the weather and seasons. The students were so happy to finally have another party at school to celebrate Valentine's Day. Our first graders are gearing up to put on a great music program coming up soon called "The Box". We can't wait to see how it turns out!

2nd Grade: Students in 2nd grade were so excited that February was finally here. They enjoyed decorating their Valentine bags, sharing cards with their friends and visiting at the Valentine party. In Math we finished up Multiplication, and worked on Money, Length, and are now working on Subtraction with regrouping. In Science, we are studying weather, weather tools and the seasons. In Social Studies, we are starting to learn our 50 states. We have already learned the Northern and Southern States. We are also learning about America's past through folktales and tall tales. In Reading, we're revisiting character traits and text structure. In English, we're learning how to use commas and quotation marks.

3rd Grade: In Third Grade Math, we are working on division and will start comparing fractions next week and will be working on that for two weeks. We will also be taking a first math benchmark next week. Social Studies classes have been reviewing Geography. Students have mastered all their Oceans, Continents, and countries of North America. We have begun to review the 50 states in song and in activities. Next are the capital cities. Science classes have completed the Earth's Forces with a lab where they made erupting volcanoes and a landslide! They also studied Earth's Resources learning how to conserve natural resources in their day to day activities. Third grade English class has been studying adverbs and adjectives. We are also working hard in Power Our. We are busy strengthening our punctuation, grammar, and handwriting skills. Students used their creativity to create Valentines bags and had a Valentines party. In Reading we have been learning about drama and the elements of characters, dialogue, setting, scenes and stage directions. They are working hard on closing all their reading strategies.

4th Grade: Reading students have been focusing on the fiction genre and the elements it contains while practicing various strategies in their class work and understanding why it is important to apply them. We have been working to learn revising and editing strategies this six weeks in E.L.A. The students continue to strengthen their writing skills through writing expository essays each week. In Social Studies students are studying about Texas becoming a republic after a revolution and rebellion against Mexico.

5th Grade: In fifth grade math, we have started preparing for the STAAR test in April. Reading is preparing to take the STAAR test, as well. They are actively participating to practice their skills on STAAR like assessments and activities. In writing, the students are preparing to write an opinion essay. This can be both argumentative and persuasive. I can't wait to see how persuasive they can be in their writing. In social studies, we are reading about the struggles and compromises involved in writing the U.S. Constitution. They will be able to explain how the Constitution limits the power of government through a system of checks and balances.

PE/Music/Library:

In PE, we are glad to be finished with all the Fitness Gram testing. The students did a great job and are glad to be playing games again. Roadrunners are going strong with leaders emerging from each grade level. We look forward to the warmer weather!
