

AP Spanish Summer Work

In both AP Spanish classes students will work out of a specific Spanish grammar textbook, **available in the school library**. Students are **NOT** allowed to write in the book itself. They need to use their own paper. In their work, students need to number the unit, activity, and page(s). They are required to write **only** the answers. All work is due the first day of the new school year. Students can access the website **you tube** or any of a myriad of websites that have Spanish grammar video tutorials to further study and explore any topic or aspect of the Spanish material they are expected to complete. This work is worth 25% of your first grade. **No late work will be accepted.**

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Since this is INDEPENDENT work, I do not guarantee I will be available during my summer vacation.

For AP Spanish Literature and Culture students need to check out **Una Vez Más**, and complete Lección 1, Lección 2, and Lección 3. Each lección is divided into different sections. From each section students are to complete **ejercicio de reflexión**, study the grammatical lesson, complete **Ejercicios de comprobación**, and at the end of each leccion write **Actividades de comunicación creative #1 (only the first one) according to directions in the book**

For AP Spanish Language and Culture students need to check out **Abriendo paso, Gramática**, and complete All of **Unidad 1, and Unidad 2**. Study the grammar presented at the beginning of each section of each lesson, and write the answers on a clean piece of paper. Number the unit, section, and page the work comes from. **Write only the answers** to the exercises and number the answers in the order they belong in the exercise or activity.

Notice that **Unidad 1** starts on page 1 and ends on page 48. This is where your summer work begins. **Unidad 2** begins on page 49 and ends on page 94. This is where your summer work ends.

Remember that this work is due the first day of the new school year, so pace yourself and do not leave everything to the last minute. Enjoy your summer and see you when the new school year begins.
