VII. PROGRAMS AND REPORTS

.01 ANNUAL ENGLISH LEARNER REPORT

English learner students are those students for whom there is a report of a primary language other than English on the state-approved Home Language Survey and who lack the clearly defined English language skills of listening, comprehension, speaking, reading, and writing necessary to succeed in the school's regular instructional programs. Dr. Kaiwan Yuen, Director of Student Programs, and Soo Jin Choi, District English Learner Teacher on Special Assignment, reviewed District English learner enrollment figures from 2011-12 with 40.9% to 38% in 2017-18 and a breakdown of English learners by site. Buena Park School District is required by California law to assess English language proficiency and reclassify students according to defined areas of criteria. The California English Language Development Test (CELDT) is the test currently being used, however, effective July 1, 2018, it is being replaced by the English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC), which is aligned to 2012 ELD standards. Reclassification criteria and a history of reclassification rates was shared, along with English learner proficiency rates in English language arts and math.

Discussion was held regarding Outdoor Science Camp. Buena Park School District schools arrange for sixth grade students to attend Outdoor Science Camp. During recent years, inequities between schools have developed with both the camp programs that are offered and the expense per student. Over time, Outdoor Science Camp has evolved to constitute an integral part of the District's educational program, prohibiting or restricting active solicitation for donations and/or fundraising by District and school staff to support the program and requiring that the District pay the costs for camp for all students. Board members have expressed a desire for equity among schools in regards to the expense per student. Options were discussed regarding the timing and implementation of an equitable process for Outdoor Science Camp selection and registration expense per student. Board members requested that research be conducted as to the process other neighboring school districts are following, in regards to Outdoor Science Camp. Buena Park School District schools will continue the reservation process for 2018-19 Outdoor Science Camp, already well underway. An equitable structure for Outdoor Science Camp selection and expense will be implemented prior to the 2019-20 school year.

Additional Hours for 2018 Summer Professional Development for Certificated Employees

Additional Support for the Supervision of Students for Educational Opportunity for Parents at Gilbert School

In order to facilitate the needs of families that would like to attend English as a Second Language (ESL) classes at Gilbert School, additional support is needed to assist in the supervision to allow parents with young children to participate. In June 2013, the Legislature adopted a new funding system for California Schools known as the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF). The goal of the new funding formula is to simplify how state funding is provided to local educational agencies (LEAs). Under the new funding system, revenue limits and most state categorical programs are eliminated. LEAs will receive funding based on the demographic profile of the students (specifically, low-income students, English learners, and foster youth) they serve and gain greater flexibility to use these funds to improve the outcomes of students.

As part of the LCFF, the Legislature included an accountability component known as the Local Control Accountability Plan or LCAP. Each school district in developing the LCAP must address eight state priorities (student achievement, student engagement, other student outcomes, school climate, parental involvement, basic services, implementation of CCSS, and course access) and solicit input and consult with parents, teachers, students, school administrators, and school employees. As part of the process, school districts are also required to hold a public hearing to solicit the recommendations and comments of members of the public regarding specific actions and expenditures in the LCAP, which is scheduled for May 29, 2018.

In accordance with Governing Board Policy 0460 Local Control and Accountability Plan, District staff has completed outreach efforts with the community, students and staff, including surveys and focus group interviews, to identify potential revisions for the District's 2018-19 LCAP. The Governing Board shall review an initial draft of the 2018-19 LCAP, including ongoing tasks from 2017-18 and potential revisions as developed by staff from community outreach efforts.

Mr. Magnuson and Mr. Holash presented an overview on the development of the District's Local Control Accountability Plan Update (LCAP). The Governing Board reviewed and discussed the LCAP revisions for 2018-19 and provided guidance for further development. The Governing Board will consider approval of the 2018-19 LCAP on June 11, 2018.






