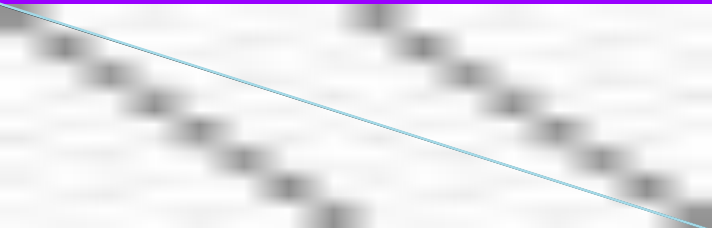

Communication

- Cell phones – school telephones – Internet Safety, parent e-mail addresses
- Students are not permitted to use their cell phones during the day – no phone calls or texts
- Attendance Procedures– calls to parents – calls to school
- Tardy policy – school begins at 7:30 am
- Early morning drop off is not permitted.
- You must send in a note to pick up your child early. Your child will be given a pass. We cannot call into a classroom during the class period.

Communication continued...

- If your child leaves his/her lunch, homework, sports equipment, book or permission slip at home.....
 - Allow him/her to take the consequences
 - We will advance lunch money
 - Athletic equipment, large projects or other materials will be held in the main office.

Medical Guidelines

- If a 6th grade student has turned 11 years of age, he/she MUST have received the Tdap and meningococcal vaccines to attend school. Proof of vaccination from the doctor MUST be on file at school. This requirement will be followed throughout the year.
- A review of your child's records will take place early in September. If there is no written record of vaccination, the student will NOT be allowed to return to school until such documentation is provided. This is a State mandate and we are obliged by law to comply.
- Please check with your physician now so that your child can attend school in the fall.

Medical info continued...

- Absentee notes are to be given directly to the main office by the student and will be forwarded to the nurses for filing.
- Students who are sick must be seen by the nurse prior to dismissal from school. The nurse will call the parent, not the student.
