COMMUNITY COLLEGE

- Must be 18 years of age or have a high school diploma or GED
- Cannot apply until spring semester, typically in March/April
 - www.cccapply.org
- Must take placement test in the Spring



APPLICATION PROCESS CSU/UC

CSU - www2.calstate.edu/apply

- Application will also require:
 - Official Transcripts (DO NOT send one until they request one from you. Most only ask for final)
 - Official Test Scores (SAT send to code 3594). (ACT send to one CSU before you take exam and then you can add other CSUs for free)

UC - admissions.universityofcalifornia.edu

- Application will also require:
 - 4 out of 8 personal insight questions
 - Additional comments, if relevant
 - Official Transcripts (DO NOT send one until they request one from you. Most only ask for final)
 - Official Test Scores (SAT/ACT send to only one campus all will get it)

SENDING TRANSCRIPTS REMINDERS

CSUs and UCs – **DO NOT REQUIRE** a transcript when APPLYING

 Please do not request them on Naviance – if you already have, please delete

Common Application and Schools that require a School Report (SR)


- AUTOMATICALLY get sent when you request SR
- Please do not request transcripts separately on Naviance – if you already have, please delete



UC ELIGIBILITY INDEX

Statewide Context

If you're in the top 9 percent of California high school graduates and aren't admitted to any of the UC campuses you apply to, you'll be offered a spot at another campus if space is available.

Eligible in the Local Context

If you are a California resident and rank in the top 9 percent of students in your California high school class — and your high school participates in our ELC program — you may be eligible for ELC designation.

Campuses draw from 14 academic and personal factors approved by University faculty, including:

Grades and test scores and:

- Quality of senior year program
- Special talents, achievements & awards
- Promise for leadership
- Recent, marked improvement in academic performance
- Significant community service
- Participation in student government
- Intensive study and exploration of other cultures

Personal Insight Questions

- Applicants are asked to respond to four out of eight questions.
- Each response is limited to a maximum of 350 words.
- Which questions you choose to answer is entirely up to you: But you should select questions that are most relevant to your experience and that best reflect your individual circumstances.

AVOID COMMON MISTAKES

- Talking about one campus: You're talking to all UC campuses you apply to in your responses
- Inappropriate use of humor
- Creative writing (poems, clichés)
- Quotations: We want to know your thoughts & words, not someone else's
- Generalities: Stick to facts and personal examples
- Repetition: Give us new info. we can't find in other sections of the application
- Asking philosophical questions: Get to the point and tell us what you mean
- Acronyms: Spell it out for us!

Additional Comments Section

- Use Additional Comments box for clarification and expansion of important details.
- Describe anything else that you have not had the opportunity to include elsewhere in your application.
- The Additional Comments section is not required.

TIPS FOR STUDENTS

Presenting Themselves in the Application

- Carefully complete the application:
 - Tell us everything they want us to know
 - Major(s) of interest, if decided
 - Family background
 - Participation in activities
 - Use transcript(s) don't guess about grades
 - Avoid abbreviations/acronyms

All of these tips provide context and clarity

PRIVATE SCHOOL GENERAL INFO

- It is important that you ALWAYS read ALL INSTRUCTIONS thoroughly!
- Remember the following:
 - You must work with your counselor to apply to private schools
 - You must use Naviance if you are applying to a college/university
 - Deadlines are not suggestions!

APPLICATION PROCESS PRIVATE COLLEGES

- Every school has it's own process
- Check if they use the Common Application www.commonapp.org
- Application will also require:
 - Personal College Essay
 - Required Supplemental Essay (varies by college)
 - Teacher Letter of Recommendations
 - SR: School Report (Through Counselor)
 - Official Transcripts (included in the SR)
 - Official Test Scores
- Application for Financial Aid may require:
 - CSS Profile CollegeBoard website
 - FAFSA

DEFINITIONS OF ADMISSION OPTIONS IN HIGHER EDUCATION



STUDENTS: WHICH COLLEGE ADMISSION PROCESS BEST SUITS YOU?

Non-Restrictive Application Plans

Regular Decision

DEFINITION:

Students submit an application by a specified date and receive a decision in a clearly stated period of time.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Rolling Admission

DEFINITION:

Institutions review applications as they are submitted and render admission decisions throughout the admission cycle.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Early Action (EA)

DEFINITION:

Students apply early and receive a decision well in advance of the institution's regular response date.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Students are not restricted from applying to other institutions and have until May 1 to consider their options and confirm enrollment.

Restrictive Application Plans

Early Decision (ED)

DEFINITION:

Students make a commitment to a first-choice institution where, if admitted they definitely will enroll. The application deadline and decision deadline occur early.

COMMITMENT:

BINDING

Restrictive Early Action (REA)

DEFINITION:

Students apply to an institution of preference and receive a decision early. They may be restricted from applying ED or EA or REA to other institutions. If offered enrollment, they have until May 1 to confirm.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Students are responsible for determining and following restrictions.

PROVISIONAL ADMISSIONS

- All admission decisions are <u>provisional</u> until all required documents, including final transcripts of work in progress are received in the Office of Admissions.
- Failure to complete required courses or other eligibility requirements will void admission to the university.

AFTER THE APPLICATION

- You should receive an email confirmation that a school received your application
- Set up "portal" for each school AND some schools may require an email account through their school
- Make sure your email is correct and professional on the application
- Follow all directions: Send Scores, Transcripts, etc. (Deadlines and request may vary between individual students"
- Check your account frequently: Students are responsible for monitoring their progress (at least once a week!)
