SUMMER SCHOOL INFORMATION/REGISTRATION – 2019

PURPOSE

To provide educational opportunities for students to earn credit for courses failed during the regular school year and to strengthen areas of weakness for End of Course test remediation.

DATE/TIMES

June 3 – June 28 1st period 8 – 10:10 a.m.
 2nd period 10:20 a.m. – 12:30 p.m.

Classes are held Monday through Friday.

REGISTRATION DATES AND FEES

Registration is ongoing from April 1 – June 3, 2019. The cost is \$150 per class, and students may take up to two courses for credit recovery. Each course is worth one semester of credit. Registration must be completed and payment received in full by the first day of class (June 3.) Any installment payment plans must be approved by the principal. Students who fail to pay in full will be withdrawn from the program and will not receive credit for any courses taken.

COURSES OFFERED

Instruction in Algebra I will be provided by a certified instructor. All other core subjects are offered for credit recovery through the Odyssey curriculum program. Students must have attempted the course previously during the regular school year to be approved for credit recovery. Certain elective courses are also offered for original credit through the Odyssey computer program. An instructor will be available in the lab to help students with any questions or help they might need. All course work must be completed by the end of Summer School in order for credit to be received. Courses not completed by the end of summer school will not be carried over to the next school year. A student must receive a grade of 70 to receive credit for the semester that had been previously failed.

Elective courses (all are one semester credit) offered on Odyssey include the following:

- BIM (Business Information Management) – A and B (1 semester each)
- Civil War History
- Environmental Science
- Essentials of Business
- Essentials of Communication (Speech)
- Health
- Integrated Physics and Chemistry (IPC) –only available for 9th graders
- Music Theory
- Personal and Family Living
- Personal Financial Literacy
- Psychology
- Vietnam War Era
- 20th Century American History

Credit is awarded based upon completion of all units required within the course. Summer school may be taken by students who failed a course the previous year or who have moved into Farmersville ISD prior to the end of the school year and are at risk of not graduating on time due to lack of credits. Summer School through Farmersville ISD is not open to students outside of the district.

END OF COURSE TEST REMEDIATION

Remediation courses will be offered in Algebra I and English for students who failed the EOC test. These courses are designed to help students pass the EOC retests in June. Passing these tests will enable these students to avoid taking remedial courses in the fall. Remediation courses begin June 10 and conclude June 21. The EOC retests are the week of June 24 - 28. There is no tuition charge for these courses.

ATTENDANCE

Students must attend at least 18 of the 20 days in which summer school is in session. Any absences beyond this limit (regardless of the reason) will result in a loss of credit. On the third absence, a student will be dropped from the summer school class. No refund will be given or credit earned. Three tardies to class count as an absence. Students must attend at least 36 hours in each instructor-led class in addition to passing course requirements to earn credit. Odyssey courses require satisfactory completion of the course with a grade of 70 or higher to earn credit.

TRANSPORTATION

Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from school for summer school.

REFUNDS

No refunds of tuition will be made after the first day of class. Any student guilty of a serious violation or repeated minor violations of the Student Code of Conduct will be removed from the summer school program. No refund of tuition will be given.

STUDENT BEHAVIOR

All students should adhere to the Student Code of Conduct as adopted by Farmersville ISD. All rules, including dress code policy, remain in effect during the summer school term. Students may be dismissed from summer school for any serious violation or repeated violations of the Student Code of Conduct.

FREE LUNCH

Summer school students are invited to participate in the free lunch program at one of the elementary campuses during the summer school session. The location of the free lunch program will be given to all students at the start of summer school. Lunch will be served on the days summer school is in session. Transportation will not be provided.
