# ST. PIUS X HIGH SCHOOL PROFILE 2018-2019

St. Pius X High School is a Catholic college preparatory school of the Archdiocese of Santa Fe. We serve God and the community through faith, love and respect and inspire learning, leadership and service.

### Introduction and Accreditation

Albuquerque, located at the foot of the Sandia Mountains, has a metro area population of 908,252. It is the home of the University of New Mexico, Sandia National Laboratories, Kirtland Air Force Base, and many high-tech and aerospace industries. Its inhabitants enjoy the blend of Hispanic, Anglo, Native American, African American, and Asian American cultures.

St. Pius X is a diocesan, co-educational, college-preparatory high school; it is accredited by District and School by AdvancEd. Fall 2018 enrollment is 640 students—ethnic background of students: 65% Hispanic, 26% Caucasian, 5% Native American, 3% Asian, and 1% African American. Two international students, one from China and one from Vietnam, currently attend St. Pius X.

All 62 faculty members have a bachelor's degree and 69% hold advanced degrees. Pupil/teacher ratio is approximately 10 to 1. Pupil/Counselor ratio is approximately 213 to 1.

<u>SPX Academic Letters</u> are awarded to qualified juniors and seniors who have attained a 3.5 GPA or above for four or more semesters (need not be consecutive semesters). A 2<sup>nd</sup> year pin is awarded to those who complete two more semesters before graduation.

<u>National Honor Society</u> eligibility requirements are a 3.5 cumulative GPA or above for four or more semesters and application to the moderators. In addition, these students are recommended by teachers for strong character, leadership, and community service. NHS members continue service projects and peer tutoring throughout high school.

<u>Community Service Letters</u> are awarded to students who perform 120+ hours per year. Students may receive one Community Service Letter and one pin for each additional year of service (1 letter and 3 pins in total).

<u>AP®</u> and <u>Honors Courses</u> are offered to approved applicants who have natural ability accompanied by a strong desire for academic enrichment and college level coursework. These classes demand more creativity, critical thinking, independent research, and written communication than the standard St. Pius X college preparatory curriculum. Students must apply and be approved for these classes.

## **ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP®) AND HONORS COURSES**

St. Pius X High School policy encourages all students enrolled in Advanced Placement courses to sit for the May examinations. Of 356 tests taken by 188 students, 7% of examinees earned a score of 5 and 21% earned a score of 4 and 35% earned a score of 3. AP® Scholars 33; AP® Scholars with Honors 13; AP® Scholars with Distinction 10; Average score: 3.47.

**CREDITS AND GRADES** All grades are recorded in letters. The 4-point grade system is used at St. Pius X.
