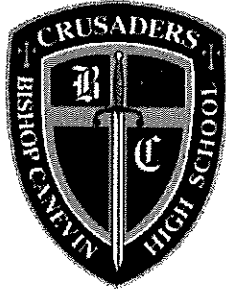

SCHOOL PROFILE 2017-2018

Founded in 1959, Bishop Canevin High School is located in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and offers a competitive college preparatory curriculum, admitting students from area neighborhoods of Western Pa. and internationally. Our current enrollment for the 2017-18 academic year is 239 students. Bishop Canevin employs a total of 26 teachers and administrators with 64% holding a master's degree or higher. The Class of 2017 received \$4.6 million in scholarship offers with a 99% college placement rate. Bishop Canevin is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.
