What are we studying this year?

Reading Focus students will be working on improving reading skills.

English 1 students will be reading informational texts, poetry, and narrative texts. They will do a lot of writing and analyzing texts. Our focus in English 1 is mastery of the standards for English 1 (a copy will be given out after diagnostic testing).
