- Weekly Parent Newsletters

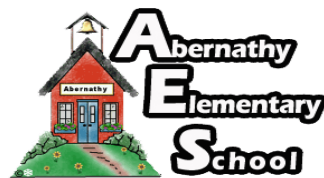
Equip Families with Tools to Enhance and Extend Learning Strategies:

- Provide families with information and best practices related to age appropriate developmental expectations.
- Utilizing a parent bulletin board to share information on upcoming school and community events.
- Use research-based resources to provide families with information related to child development topics.
- Parent University in both the Fall and Spring

Develop Staff Skills in evidence-based practices that support families in meeting their children's learning benchmarks: Attend training at ESC17 and campus site-visit in the Fall of 2017.

Evaluate family engagement efforts and use evaluations for continuous improvement using strategies such as the following:
