CONTINUE TO USE BEST PRACTICES FOR STAYING HEALTHY

While we would prefer to be at school, in order to slow the spread of COVID-19, we will continue to implement the recommended practices of social distancing and eliminating the gathering of more than 5 people in a room. All of our school buildings are closed to the public, and our buildings are operating with only a few people on each site. Almost all employees are now working from home. Everyone should continue to practice the following:

- Frequent hand washing. Wash hands frequently, including fingertips, with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use alcohol-based hand sanitizers.
- Avoid gatherings.
- If you become ill, call your doctor's office before going into the clinic. Avoid close contact with others who are sick. Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then immediately discard the tissue in the trash. Avoid touching eyes, mouth, and nose.

E-LEARNING RESUMES
MARCH 30 – MAY 1 (PHASE 1)
MAY 4 – MAY 21 (PHASE 2, if needed)

By order of the Governor, the earliest we could return to school is Monday, May 4. However, we are prepared for the likelihood that school will continue under e-learning through the end of the school year. When we return from Spring Break, we will continue to utilize our e-Learning lessons provided by our teachers.

Attached to this letter are two calendars identifying the next 5 weeks (Phase 1) as well as the final 3 weeks of the school year (Phase 2).

We will happily re-open school in May, if possible. As we monitor the situation over the next several weeks, we will communicate the decision once we know more.

- Student e-Learning Days will be on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays each week.
- Teachers will have Mondays and Fridays for preparation and planning and will continue to have office hours from 9:00am – 11:30am and 12:30pm – 2:00pm each day, Monday through Friday.
- Elementary and Middle School students can pick up the printed material for Day #11 through the remainder of the school year by going to the front door of your school building. Materials will be available for pick up beginning Monday, April 6.
- High School students will continue to receive their e-learning through the Canvas platform.

With April now unavailable for our important spring activities/events, we will be continually evaluating our options as we await clear information about what May and June will bring.

Thank you for your continued support of our schools. Our number one priority is the safety and well-being of the students we serve. The cooperation of everyone in the community is necessary for the effective resolution of this health issue.
