Check-in Process: Committee completed check-in process

1. BT Feedback: There were no comments on BT from the schools.

2. LEA Parent Involvement Policy: DIC members looked over the district policy. Parent review of Title 1 Schools will be on October 30th.

3. District Safety District will be getting re-keyed within the next year one campus at a time and a new key policy will be developed. Bus barn is getting a new fence for security purposes. Reminder to staff to use step stools and be mindful to not carry objects that are heavy or too high that obstructs ones view.

4. Alternative Performance Evaluation Teachers who are evaluated as highly qualified for 3 years are eligible for an Alternative Evaluation. DIC committee members reviewed the evaluation. Mr. Lotts will share with Admin for approval for the 2019-2020 school year.

5. Other Concerns:

- * Le Pera asked if there could be an incentive in place for teachers who have perfect attendance like we do for students. This item will be discussed at the next DIC meeting in October.
- * Blake asked if we could have ESS represented at DIC meetings, it was discussed that the Sped teachers are represented by the school rep. of the school they are assigned to.
- * WJH wanted to know if we have goals for improving student attendance, it was discussed that we strive for 100% every day. The district has attendance liaisons and each school is working diligently at turning paperwork in to local agencies for repeat offenders. Grab and Go lunches, kids are throwing the food. The school wanted to know if we could donate to homeless or foodbank. The program does not allow us to donate the food. Students can give to another student or take it home for snack later after school.
- * Blake wanted to know if students who bring their own lunch do they also have to grab a lunch tray? Kids who bring their own lunch do not have to get a lunch tray.
- * Junior High students are hanging out during high school games and causing great disruption. It was discussed that students who are not high school students will have to bring a parent or guardian to high school games. This will go before the school board for approval.

6. School Reports

Blake: Blake had 84% attendance for parent/teacher conferences and a very successful book fair thanks to Mrs. Okershausen's hard work and dedication! As we near the end of the quarter, Blake teachers are busy doing report card testing and getting ready for Data Day after break. The first quarter writing test was given last week. On September 13th Blake had a Literacy Night for Title I students. Teachers have had ER trainings on DIBELS progress monitoring and Open Court. On September 27th at 8:25 CRIT will be putting on an assembly for Native American Days. During this last week of September 2nd graders will take a field trip to Bill Williams.

Le Pera: Le Pera's Student Council has concluded its election process for the student council leadership positions. Congratulations to Jovanny Hernandez (president), Tillman Wedemeyer (vice

president), Alex Puhuyesva (secretary), and Jarius Eddy (Treasurer). Le Pera's girl's volleyball team plays at Quartzite at 3:30 on Sept. 25th. On Thursday, Sept. 27th participants of this year's "Little Miss CRIT" will be hosting a school wide assembly. On Saturday, Oct 13th Le Pera's PTSO will be holding a pancake breakfast fundraiser at 8:00 am. Oct. 19th Le Pera will be having picture retakes. On Saturday, Oct 20th Le Pera teachers will be participating in an all-day SPDG grant training (Module 7). On Saturday, Oct 27th Le Pera will host its annual girls volleyball tournament beginning at 8:00 am and ending around 3:30 pm. On Tuesday, Oct 30th Le Pera 8th graders will be taking a field trip to AWC in Yuma.

WES: Parent Teacher conferences on Sept. 5 had an 87% attendance. We will have the Native America Assembly on Thursday Sept. 27. Student council has been selling snow cones on Friday's for a dollar. Early-Release days in September have been spent on reviewing our SMART goals and guided reading. We had our Module 2 SPDG training on Saturday, September 22. Writing Quarterly testing took place last week. Tutoring began on September 4, we have about 90 kids enrolled. Free eye screenings took place last week and went well. We will begin the bag breakfast after break. Literacy Night was September 19, we had over 40 students in attendance.

PHS: Parker High School has restarted our math rotation program during bronc time. All students who were failing a math class from progress 1 are going to a math teacher for reteach on their specific subject until the next grading period. We are also in the process of updating our course descriptions and pre-requisites for board approval. We will also be taking our ¼ benchmark assessments across every subject this week. Our junior class also completed the ASVAB test which provides them with a career inventory and military qualification score.

WJH: Wallace Junior High has been following their BT calendars with no issues reported. In sports, both Football and Volleyball have played a few games and continue to work toward improvement. The "B" Football team's record is 1-2, and the "A" Football team's record is 1-2. They will play their next game Tuesday, September 25 against Thunderbolt in Havasu. The next Home game will be Wednesday, October 17 against Kingman. Volleyball's "B" team has a record of 1-3, and the "A" team has a record of 3-1. The next game for Volleyball will be Wednesday, September 26 at Home against Thunderbolt. Parent-Teacher Conferences were held on Wednesday, September 5 in the Dome. Attendance was moderate, with 7th and 8th grade teachers reporting anywhere from 50%-60% of students represented at the meetings. Picture Day for Wallace Junior High was held on Friday, September 21. On Thursday, September 27, the Native American Dancers will hold an assembly for the WJH students at 2:00 in the Dome. Finally, the First Quarter Awards Assembly will be held on Thursday, October 18 in the Dome.
