- New Business
 - Reading data-Where are we? Interventions and teachers working together to get kids reading and we are showing growth. Third grade teacher movement to become a reading interventionist and dissolution of a Kindergarten class to replace teacher. Vision for her is to be a RTI Coordinator, Professional Development, etc. The information included past levels, current levels, and a trajectory of levels.
 - PTO Fundraiser Pick up Fast Pass-Others--Safety issue that prevents us from supporting this now and other safety issues brought up about cars and children. Working on the safety issues by partnering with law enforcement. Suggestions from others on how to make this a safe procedure. Melissa Hughes made a movement to deny this fundraiser and to think of other fundraisers instead. That we move to thinking of something else. Nakesha Hunt seconded the movement by Melissa Hughes for safety concerns..
 - Farm to School Contracted Services-Geneva McWhorter is willing to come on Tuesdays to help with the Farm to School Initiative for the rest of the budget set aside for Penny Peters. Terrific Tuesdays explained and 4.5 hours a week for 18 weeks at \$25 an hour. Melissa Hughes makes the motion to approve the motion of Farm to School Contracted Services to hire Geneva McWhorter, Sarah Swan seconded it.
 - Cumberland Island Field Trip in May-Fundraisers and cost--5:15 in the morning and see the beach, wild horses, we have a waiver to write lesson plans etc and

come by that evening full of educational fun. It's costly and we need to have the children take ownership. The total is \$50 a head. We will send out a note at the end of October and early November break it down into payment pays. If you cannot afford this, here are some fundraising opportunities. We have to work to afford things to put forward our part. We will ask for sponsors to offset the costs and give scholarships. 65 total kids will be traveling.

- Furniture/decor: Our current school has a sterile environment and to spruce it up, we need to take out older decor and make it inviting for kids and parents to celebrate youth. Our old school furniture has rips. Fish tank is coming for the foyer. \$50 every time they come to take care of it every other month for servicing. Melissa Hughes makes a motion to accept both Furniture Decor for \$1,000.00 and Photography and Nakesha Hunt seconded it.
 - Photography--\$150.00: Vanessa Franks did candid shots and print the photos and frame them for \$150.00 and this is our house to feel a part of the school.
 - Refrigerator--Mr. Ford is someone who can fix refrigerators. We need someone who can repair broken refrigerators. Any suggestions?
 - GYTO Conference--Professional development for teachers in Orlando for four days \$500 for registration plus room and board. We want to send a couple of teachers this summer to get reignited. Donors Choose for matching funds is a possibility for next year.
- Comments/Questions/Concerns--Literacy Night--Thankful for books to tie in with November. Mr. Ray suggested having hotdogs and hairstyles with his youth group and community people to serve on a Saturday. Get the neighborhood involved build pride in school and help cut down on things that happened after hours.
