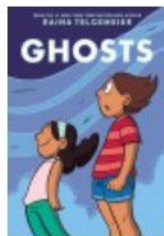

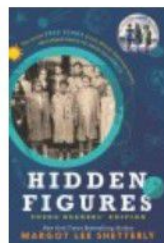

For Laughs

- **My Seventh Grade Life in Tights** (Benjamin) All Dillon wants is to be a real dancer. If he wins a scholarship at Dance-Splasion, he's on his way. The problem? His dad wants him to play football. And Dillon's freestyle crew, the Dizzee Freekz, says that dance studios are for sell-outs
- **Croak** (Damico) A delinquent sixteen-year-old is sent to live with her uncle for the summer, only to learn that he is a Grim Reaper who wants to teach her the family business. 
- **Roller Girl** (Jamieson) Astrid discovers roller derby right as she and her best friend are growing apart
- **Nimona** (Stevenson) Lord Blackheart and his sidekick, Nimona, an impulsive young shapeshifter, must prove to the kingdom that Sir Goldenloin and the Institution of Law Enforcement and Heroics aren't the heroes everyone thinks they are.
- **Popular: a memoir** (van Wagenen) A high school student attempts to change her social status from that of a misfit to a member of the "in" crowd by following advice in a 1950s popularity guide, an experiment that triggered embarrassment, humor and unexpected surprises.


For Thrills

- **The Girl Who Drank the Moon** (Barnhill) An epic fantasy about a young girl raised by a witch, a swamp monster, and a Perfectly Tiny Dragon, who must unlock the powerful magic buried deep inside her. 
- **The Nazi Hunters** (Bascomb) The story of how, 16 years after the end of World War II, a team of undercover Israeli agents captured the Nazi war criminal, Adolf Eichmann, in a remote area of Argentina and brought him to trial in Israel for crimes committed during the Holocaust.
- **Magnus Chase & the Gods of Asgard** (Riordan) Magnus Chase, a homeless boy living in Boston, finds out he is the son of a Norse god.
- **Steelheart** (Sanderson) At age eight, David watched as his father was killed by an Epic, a human with superhuman powers, and now, ten years later, he joins the Reckoners--the only people who are trying to kill the Epics and end their tyranny.
- **The Blackthorn Key** (Sands) In 1665 London, Christopher Rowe, apprentice to an apothecary, and his best friend, Tom, try to uncover the truth behind a mysterious cult, following a trail of puzzles, codes, pranks, and 

danger toward an unearthly secret with the power to tear the world apart.

- **Variant** (Wells) Benson is relieved to escape from the foster care system and excited to make a fresh start at Maxfield Academy. But soon after arriving, Benson realizes that he's made a huge mistake. Students at Maxfield are trapped, under constant surveillance, and at war with each other -- and the punishment for rule-breakers is death.

For Twists & Turns

- **Girl in the Blue Coat** (Hesse) In Nazi-occupied Amsterdam, Hanneke -a 'finder' of black market goods- is tasked with finding a Jewish girl who has seemingly vanished into thin air, and is pulled into a web of resistance activities and secrets as she attempts to solve the mystery.
- **When** (Laurie) Maddie cannot help but see the death date of everyone she meets or sees in a photograph or on-screen, but when she predicts the death of a young boy, she becomes the center of an FBI investigation. 
- **Bomb** (Sheinkin) Recounts the scientific discoveries that enabled atom splitting, the military intelligence operations that occurred in rival countries, and the work of brilliant scientists hidden at Los Alamos.
