Title I -Level Parent and Family Engagement Policy

Building Capacity for Involvement:

To ensure effective involvement of parent and to support a partnership among the school involved, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement, each school and local educational agency assisted with Title I, Part A funds, the school has stablished the following practices:

- a) The school provides parents with assistance in understanding such topics as the challenging State academic standards, State and local assessments, the requirements of Title I, Part A, and how to monitor a child's progress and work with educators to improve the achievement of their children.  - Evening and daytime workshops will be provided for parents specifically focused on understanding the Common Core State Standards, and Smarter Balanced Assessments

 - Training to empower parents to support and assist their children's education. This may include such activities as: Family Math Training, Family Reading Night, Family EL Night, and Science Night.
 - Parents are given access to school library to check out leveled readers to provide additional reading materials to support student achievement
 - Parent Liaison working with individual parents on creating and monitoring student achievement through AERIES.
 - PBIS Specialists and Parent Liaison provide parents with community services to meet the social emotional needs of students
- c) The school educates teachers, specialized instructional support personnel, principals, and other school leaders, and other staff, with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, implement

and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between parents and the school. (20 USC 6318 (e)(3))

- At staff meetings, parent survey results are reviewed and strategies for parent engagement and partnerships are discussed and integrated in SPSA
- Parent concerns are addressed by the Parent Support Team and PBIS teams
- d) The school, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinates and integrates the parent involvement programs and activities with other Federal, State, and local programs, including public preschool programs, and conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, to encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children.  - Coordination of parent involvement activities at the site are done the Parent Liaison, ASB coordinator, and/or the SSC
 - PBIS Specialist and Parent Liaison coordinate with outside resources to include the district Parent Center for social emotional and personal needs (clothing, counseling and food)
 - Parents are encouraged to volunteer in their child's classroom, on field trips and during school wide events
