Update on church renovation

I am very pleased to share the great news that the City of Claremont Planning and Building approval process is complete. The church renovation plans are approved, and the building permits are now ready to be issued.

The next step in the process is to select a general contractor. The parish project team has selected three very qualified general contractors and asked each of them to submit a bid proposal. Below is the timeline for bids and walk-through:




- Construction drawings were submitted to the three general contractors Aug. 7.
- General contractors bid walkthrough of the church is scheduled for Aug. 15.
- Bids are due at noon on Sept 4.
- Bid review meeting is scheduled Sept. 5 at 10 a.m.
- Selection of a general contractor and contract documents will follow.
- Construction start date is scheduled for Oct 1st.
- Nine months construction project schedule.

JustAct Ministry

JustAct is a ministry that provides opportunities for education, spiritual growth and action in service to others based on the Church's social teachings. An information table will be set up on the patio beginning the weekend of Aug. 18-19. for fall programs. Details are also available through Chris Shaner at (714) 299-9939.

WHAT IS GOOD NEWS PEOPLE?

This program is a dynamic, parish-wide, faith formation program for adults. It offers an introduction to Catholic Social Teaching in a shorter format: 7 weeks in fall and 7 weeks in spring. The goals of Good News People are to explore the call to discipleship and the power of community through prayer, reflection, and action, and find renewed hope in living the Gospel and putting faith into action;

WHAT IS JUSTFAITH?

JustFaith is an extended justice education process that meets weekly, employing books, videos, guest speakers, discussion, prayer, retreats and hands-on experiences. This is a 30-week formation process. There are two retreats – one to open and one to close the program. Four dates are dedicated to group projects.

WHAT IS ENGAGING SPIRITUALITY?

Engaging Spirituality is the next step for those who have completed JustFaith. It focuses on the practical challenges of following Jesus into the broken heart of our world, inspired by the urgency and spirit of the Gospel message to our lives, to our relationships, and to our times. Participants practice "the undivided life" of Christian discipleship—engaging in contemplation while immersing ourselves in the heart of our fragmented world. This is a 20-week program.

Tradiciones de Nuestra Fe

Entre los varios santitos que de niño recuerdo haber visto en el templo, santa Rosa de Lima (1586□1617) se me ha quedado grabada por su belleza y humildad. No sé quién fue el que me la presentó por primera vez, sólo sé que la recuerdo porque era latina como yo. En su cabeza llevaba una corona de espinas de la cual brotaban rositas rojas. Según mis catequistas, ella había usado una corona de espinas a escondidas debajo de su velo de monja para recordarle que si era bella lo debía a Dios y no a sus propios méritos.

Santa Rosa (Isabel Flores de Oliva) fue canonizada en 1667 como la primera santa americana. Ella encarnaba la expresión “Gracias a Dios”. Esta frase la utilizan muchos latinos cuando reciben un cumplido o halago, para reconocer que sus talentos y virtudes se deben a Dios que bendice sus esfuerzos. Ellos, como Santa Rosa, aceptan las limita- ciones de su condición humana pero también aceptan la gracia de ser hijos e hijas del Dios que siempre nos ayuda.

- *First Communion Yr 1 (\$80/child) & Yr 2 (\$110/child)*

2 year process that meets weekly on Wednesdays to prepare young children to receive First Communion. Offered in English and Spanish.

- *Post-Communion (\$80/child)*

Weekly Wednesday gatherings for ongoing formation for young children. Offered in English and Spanish.



JR. HIGH (6TH-8TH)

- *Edge Jr. High Ministry (\$20/child)*

Weekly Wednesday gatherings that provide youth a fun place to find solid Catholic community and to experience Jesus in a profound and personal way.



HIGH SCHOOL (9TH-12TH)

- *Confirmation Yr 1 (\$200/teen) & Yr 2 (\$150/teen)*

2 year process that meets bi-weekly to prepare teens to receive Confirmation

- *The Heights High School Ministry (free)*

Sunday night gatherings where teens support each other and grow in faith and friendship while learning how to apply Catholic values and beliefs into their daily lives.



ADULTS

- *R.C.I.A. (No fee)*

2 year process to help adults become Catholic or receive their sacraments.

- *Adult Confirmation (No fee)*

9 week series that prepares adults to receive Confirmation.

- *Alpha (No fee)*

10 week series that provides adults with a practical introduction to the Christian faith.
