Established in 1860, the Academy of St. Elizabeth is the oldest high school for girls in the State of New Jersey, a designation that affirms the highest levels of tradition, excellence, and vitality. It is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools and holds membership in NJAIS, NCEA, and NAIS. The Academy of Saint Elizabeth is located in Convent Station, two miles east of Morristown, and twenty-five miles west of New York City. Its accessibility by car, train, or bus enables the Academy to draw its student population from a wide geographic area, including Morris County and the surrounding counties. The sending districts include both parochial and public elementary schools.
