## Coldspring FFA Wildlife team is headed to regional contest

On Wednesday, October 4<sup>th</sup>, three Coldspring FFA Wildlife Teams traveled to the Big Thicket National Preserve in Kountze to participate in the District FFA Wildlife Contest.

The team of Craig Wallace, Garrett Richardson, Jack Patrick, and Dustin Harrison placed 3<sup>rd</sup> overall in the contest and 2<sup>nd</sup> in district, and will advance to the Regional Contest in Nacogdoches on November 1<sup>st</sup>.

It marks the first time a team from Lincoln Junior High has competed on any Coldspring FFA teams. The district expanded the Ag program this year to include 8<sup>th</sup> graders.

Under the leadership of the COCISD Agriculture Department team of Beldon Rudloff, Ashlie Taylor, Courtney Robinson and Brandon Allen, our Ag students hit the ground running in September and show no signs of slowing down.

As participants of the Lake Livingston Restoration Projects, students helped plant 1,500 Water Willows and met former First Lady Laura Bush on Sept. 13.

Coldspring FFA members also participated in the San Jacinto County Fair & Rodeo. With a total of 24 students selling this year, our students contributed greatly to the event's record-breaking \$438,000 total sale amount. Great job!
