

Summer Reading List for Saint Dominic's School

Seventh Grade:

All students are required to read:

Tuck Everlasting by Natalie Babbitt

All students must also read two books from the list below. For one of these the student will fill out a brief traditional book report (see attached form). For the other, the student may choose one of the following creative ways to present their book:

- a video book trailer (using imovie or windows movie maker).
 - The trailer should be 1-3min long, capture some of the important characters and/or events of the book and make the viewer want to read the book. Cliff hangers are recommended. N.B. Make sure to export the project file as a movie (mp4 if using windows) when finished and save it on a flashdrive. Ask google how to do this if unsure.
- a book talk (write the script over the summer and present during class in the fall)
 - The book talk should be 2-3 minutes in length, present the major characters and setting and make the audience want to read the book. The opening of the talk should immediately capture the audience's attention and curiosity about the book. Turn in your script after your presentation.
- a visual collage with captions to summarize and evaluate the book.

Louis de Wohl has written several popular saint fiction novels including *Lay Siege to Heaven* (Catherine of Siena), *Quiet Light* (Thomas Aquinas), *The Joyful Beggar* (Saint Francis of Assisi) and *Set All Afire* (Saint Francis Xavier).

Reading books is an indispensable part of a solid education. A parent/ guardian will, therefore, be asked to write and sign a note indicating which of the books you chose and that you have read them.
