IMPORTANT DETAILS ABOUT EXAM WEEK: PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!

- 1. Dress:** No class clothes during exam week, but please do not wear pajamas to exams.
- 2. Breakfast:** All boarders with scheduled morning exams must check in at breakfast. If you do not have a morning exam, you may complete a meal sign-out in Boardingware and have it approved by the duty teacher the night before.
- 3. Exams:**
 - Exams will begin at 8:45 each morning. Take your [your assigned seat](#) 10 minutes before each exam; the sooner you're seated, the sooner everyone can begin.
 - Do NOT bring any books or study materials to main (with the exception of materials required by your teacher for the exam).
 - Turn off your cell phones and leave them on the proctor's desk (or leave them in your dorm room or locker).
 - NO food, candy, gum, or drinks will be allowed in the exam rooms during the exams.
 - Bring a watch. You are responsible for monitoring the time and keeping track of time limits for questions on exams.
 - Maximum exam lengths per grade are as follows: up to 90 min. for 7th and 8th-grade exams; up to 2 hrs. for 9th and 10th-grade exams; up to 3 hrs. for most 11th and 12th-grade exams. Exceptions are listed on the exam schedule.
- 4. Lunch on Exam Days:**
 - 12:15-12:45 (even grades)
 - 12:45-1:15 (odd grades)
- 5. Afternoons:**
 - **Assembly will take place Wednesday at 1:15.**
 - No arts classes on Wednesday or Friday
 - Study Hall on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 2:00-3:15
 - No science or language labs
 - Afternoons will have study sessions for most classes (See master schedule for details.)
 - No sign-outs on Wednesday afternoon
 - Athletics will take place on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday; there are games on Friday.
- 6. "In Bed" Times (i.e., lights out), Sunday through Thursday nights:**

 - 11th = 11:30
 - 12th = 12:00
