Frederic Area Scholarship Foundation 2018 Application Guide

The Frederic Area Scholarship Foundation (FASF) is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code. The mission of the FASF is to broaden the availability of financial assistance for Frederic High School graduates and to further support the young people of our community.

A complete packet summarizing all the local scholarships will be available in the Frederic 6-12 School Office and also from the guidance counselor in February. Many of the scholarships require specific criteria for eligibility to receive the award such as attendance at a particular school or enrollment in a specific program; attaining a specific academic performance level (top 10%, as an example); or involvement in specific activities (athletics, community service, etc.). It is also important to know that a number of scholarships do not have specific requirements and all graduating seniors may be eligible to receive them.

Scholarship recipients will be determined by a selection committee not associated with the Frederic High School and their decisions will be final. The committee will make determinations after reviewing applications and will attempt to match scholarships with deserving students. All scholarship applications will be anonymous and will include student numbers for identification.

Scholarships will be announced at Awards Night in May, prior to graduation. **Scholarships must be used in the first year following high school graduation and are awarded to full-time students only.** Typically, full-time students carry 12 credits each semester. All checks will be co-endorsed by the student and the college, university, or technical school. There are deadlines that must be met for the distribution of scholarship checks for each semester. The procedure necessary to receive scholarship checks will be explained in detailed letters that recipients will receive at Awards Night. Scholarship checks for the fall semester are typically distributed in late August/early September and checks for the second semester are usually distributed in January. **Recipients who fail to meet the deadlines or who do not attend as full-time students will forfeit their scholarships.**

A signed statement acknowledging the above information needs to be returned to the school counselor at the time your application is completed. The deadline for the applications will be set by the school counselor.

2018 Scholarship Summary

This packet contains the scholarships as of February 2018 that will be awarded to graduating seniors and other eligible students. There could be changes in individual scholarships or the amounts awarded after this date for a variety of reasons. Every effort will be made to inform students, parents, and benefactors should changes occur. The application for local scholarships is coordinated through the Guidance Office. Students do not apply for individual scholarships; rather, the application allows them to be considered for any/all of the local scholarships.

Scholarships must be used in the first year following high school graduation and are awarded to full-time students only. All checks will be co-endorsed by the student and the college, university, or technical school.

First semester distribution deadline is August 6 to September 7, 2018.

Second semester distribution is December 28, 2018 to January 18, 2019.

Students who fail to meet the above deadlines may forfeit their scholarships.

Amery Regional Medical Center Scholarship

The Amery Regional Medical Center through its satellite Clinic in Luck is sponsoring a scholarship to a graduating senior entering the health care field. Recipients may re-apply for additional monies through the Amery Clinic in subsequent years.

Luck Medical Clinic requires an 8" X 10" picture suitable for framing. Please contact the Luck Medical Clinic if there are questions regarding the picture.

Anna Antonich Memorial Scholarship

The Anna Antonich Memorial Scholarship is given in the memory of Anna (Nelson) Antonich. Anna was a Frederic resident that attended the Frederic School System prior to earning her degree from the University of Minnesota – Duluth. Anna was an excellent student and was very involved in extracurricular activities and community affairs. Anna's life was dedicated to serving children through her duties as a full-time nanny, as well as her family day care business. She also volunteered her time to work with young children in a number of ways.

Anna was a proud mother and a strong advocate for the health and education of the children in her community. The Anna (Nelson) Antonich Scholarship is targeted for a graduating Frederic High School senior who is pursuing a degree in early childhood or elementary education. In addition to the prescribed field of study, scholarship recipients should be involved students and citizens with the potential to provide positive influence to young people. This scholarship will be given in two installments with the first installment awarded at the beginning of the first semester and the remaining installment awarded at the beginning of the second semester.

Bremer Bank Scholarship - Frederic Branch

One scholarship will be given by the Bremer Bank Frederic Branch to a graduating senior that your scholarship committee views as a deserving student. We ask only that the scholarship be given to a student going on to any post-high school education and that the student has been a leader in school or community activities. The scholarship will be distributed as follows: half at the beginning of the first semester or quarter; and half at the beginning of the second semester or quarter.

The Carl & Hilda Ahlgren Education Scholarship

This scholarship was established in 2000 by the three generation of descendants of the family of Carl and Hilda Ahlgren, long-time residents of the Frederic community. Their four children graduated from the Frederic High School ('27, '29, '32 and '34) and the three boys were valedictorians of their classes. Lillie was salutatorian. All four children went on to attain undergraduate and advanced college degrees. In respect and recognition of the importance Carl and Hilda Ahlgren placed on

higher education, a scholarship will be awarded each year to a Frederic High School graduate meeting the following qualifications:

1. Ranking in the top 10% of the graduating class
2. Outstanding character
3. Academic attainment based on relative difficulty of curriculum
4. School and community activities and involvement
5. Demonstrate motivation

First consideration for this scholarship should be given to a qualifying graduate whose need is such that he or she might not be able to attend college without financial assistance.

The scholarship could be given to the same person for a second year by providing Citizen's Scholarship Foundation of Frederic a formal letter of re-application and a copy of their college or university transcript to date. Re-application must be received by April 1.

The recipient must initiate school before the end of the calendar year in which the award was received and will receive the actual funds as follows: half at the beginning of the first semester or quarter; and half at the beginning of the second semester or quarter.

Central Insurance Scholarship

One scholarship will be given by the Central insurance Branch of St. Croix Falls to a graduating senior whom the scholarship committee views as a deserving student. It is expected that the scholarship will be given to a student going on to any post-high school education (either 2- or 4-year college or vocational school) and that the student has been a leader in school or community activities. The student will receive the funds at the beginning of the first semester or quarter.

Charles E. Lewis Scholarship

This scholarship will be given to further the education in a post high school facility. This person must be a resident of Lewis, Wisconsin.

Charlie Wolden Scholarship

A scholarship has been set up by the family of Charlie Wolden in his memory and honor. Charlie was a war zone veteran of the Vietnam War. Upon retirement from the military, Major Wolden attended the University of Wisconsin, receiving a Master's Degree in Psychotherapy. Charlie spent the next 25 years providing services to our Veterans which included individual and group counseling in areas such as Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), alcohol and drug assessment, and suicide prevention referrals. Charlie was also strongly involved in civic issues and served on the Frederic Village Board as a trustee and as Village President.

The scholarship is for a graduating senior who is pursuing a career in the area of mental health/psychology or related field. The scholarship will be issued in two disbursements, one for each semester of the recipient's freshman year. The recipient should have a good academic record, be a good citizen, and be involved in school and/or community affairs. The student may attend a 2-year, 4-year, or vocational institution.

C.J. Franseen Merit Award

A Merit Scholar Award was established in 1969 by Dr. and Mrs. Harvey J. Raszkowski to honor Mrs. Raszkowski's parents, Mr. and Mrs. C. J. Franseen, pioneer residents of the Frederic community, who maintained a concerned interest in the education of the youth of Frederic.

Qualifications for this scholarship include:

1. Rank in the top 10% of the graduating class
2. Character
3. Academic attainment based on relative difficulty of curriculum
4. School and community activities.
5. Motivation

The check will be given in two payments: half at the beginning of the first semester or quarter; and half at the beginning of the second semester or quarter.

Community Education Scholarship

Through Community Education, communities embrace the idea of life-long learning and make a commitment to work together to meet the needs of citizens. Given this mission, one scholarship will be given by Frederic Community Education Program to a graduating senior who will be pursuing any post-high school education. Preference will be given to a student who has exhibited a zest for learning and has shared their talents with the community through volunteer service.

Dahlberg Memorial Scholarship

The Dahlberg Memorial Scholarship was established in 2015 by Marlene Dahlberg and family of Frederic. The Dahlberg family has a long history of community involvement in the Frederic area and has had children and grandchildren graduate from the Frederic School District. The establishment of two scholarships continues this tradition of giving and supporting the community and its young people. Preference for the awards would go to students who are not necessarily at the top of the class academically but who have potential and the desire to continue their education. The check will be given in two payments: half at the beginning of the first semester or quarter; and half at the beginning of the second semester or quarter.

Dan Gabrielson Memorial Scholarship

The Dan Gabrielson Memorial Scholarship is given in the spirit and memory of Dan Gabrielson. All three of Dan and Peggy's children attended the Frederic School System. Dan was an unassuming individual, but bright, caring, considerate and highly successful. He was an advocate for youth, education, and an outdoor enthusiast. He did not seek out the spotlight, yet he was adored by many. He did not seek to lead, yet he had a natural leadership style. He was probably not noticed by many when he was in high school, yet he left a legacy few people ever attain. Dan was killed in action in Iraq on July 9, 2003. Recipients of this award will be honored by Dan's legacy and what they have the potential to become.

Eligible Recipients: Graduating seniors not in the top 10 % of the class, but who have depth of character, untapped potentials, and likelihood to grow and succeed in the future, and will be attending a university or technical college.

Dr. Lawrence Pederson Scholarship

The Dr. Lawrence Pederson Scholarship is given in the spirit and memory of Dr. Pederson, a veterinarian who served the Frederic area for many years. Dr. Pederson was an unassuming individual but bright, caring, considerate and always willing to assist people in need. He did not seek the spotlight, yet was respected and admired by many. The recipient of this award will be honored and encouraged by Dr. Pederson's legacy to achieve his/her own potential. The scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior pursuing post high school education at either a two- or four-year college or a vocational/technical school. The student will have a good academic record, be a good citizen, and demonstrate community involvement.

Donna and Roman L. Weinzierl Memorial Scholarship

This memorial scholarship was established to assist students entering the fields of medicine, nursing and related health care fields or an industrial arts (technology) teaching career. This scholarship is based upon the following criteria:

1. Applicants accepted in medicine, nursing or related health care fields shall rank in the top 10% of their graduating class. Those applicants pursuing a degree in teaching industrial arts (technology) shall rank in the top 15% of their graduating class
2. Recipients must attend an educational institution granting a degree in one of the above fields

If the Scholarship does not have a qualifying applicant in a given year, the award shall carry over to the succeeding year. The recipient must initiate schooling before the end of the calendar year in which the award was received and will receive the actual funds as follows: half at the beginning of the first semester or quarter; and half at the beginning of the second semester or quarter.

Donna Struck LeFurgy Weinzierl Memorial Scholarship

(Established by Roman Weinzierl in memory of his wife, Donna)

This memorial scholarship is designed to assist students desiring to enter the field of medicine, nursing, or related health fields. This scholarship is based on the following qualifications:

1. Applicants should be in the upper 10 percent of their class
2. Academic attainment based on relative difficulty of curriculum
3. Motivation
4. Extra-curricular activity or involvement

The recipient must initiate schooling before the end of the calendar year in which the award was received and will receive the actual funds as follows: half at the beginning of the first semester or quarter; and half at the beginning of the second semester or quarter.

Students receiving this award remain eligible to reapply in succeeding years by providing the Frederic Area Scholarship Foundation a formal letter of re-application and a copy of their college or university transcript to date. Re-application must be received by April 1.

Donna Struck LeFurgy Weinzierl Memorial Scholarship

(Established by Roman Weinzierl in memory of his wife, Donna)

This memorial scholarship is designed to assist students desiring to enter the field of industrial arts/technology. Preference will be given to students seeking a career in teaching. The scholarship is based on the following qualifications:

1. Applicants should be in the upper 75 % of their class
2. Academic attainment based on relative difficulty of curriculum
3. Extra-curricular activity or involvement and motivation

The recipient must initiate schooling before the end of the calendar year in which the award was received and will receive the actual funds as follows: half at the beginning of the first semester or quarter; and half at the beginning of the second semester or quarter.

Students receiving this award remain eligible to reapply in succeeding years by providing the Frederic Area Scholarship Foundation a formal letter of re-application and a copy of their college or university transcript to date. Re-application must be received by April 1.

The Family of John & Rose Shull Memorial Scholarship

(Established by Harlan and Aurora Shull in memory of the Shull family)

This memorial scholarship is designed to assist students to further their education in a post-high school degree program of their choice. The recipient's character, motivation, and high school attendance will be determining factors for this selection. There are no other parameters.

The recipient must initiate schooling before the end of the calendar year in which the award was received. The check will be distributed in two payments: half at the beginning of the first semester or quarter; and half at the beginning of the second semester or quarter.

The Fred Grimm and Karen Carpenter Scholarship

Fred Grimm and Karen Carpenter will give two scholarships to students who have shown a special energy and spirit along with determination and motivation beyond that of their peers. The scholarships are designed for students who will make their marks in the world. The recipient may begin his/her school at any post-high school education including 2-year, 4-year, or vocational school. While students considering the field of education might be given preference, all professional fields are to be considered by the selectors. The recipient should have a good academic record, be a quality citizen who is respectful of others, and has overcome obstacles to succeed in his/her chosen field. The scholarship(s) are designed to motivate students who have financial needs to attend college. The scholarship will be distributed as follows: half at the beginning of the first semester or quarter; and half at the beginning of the second semester or quarter.

Frederic Area Scholarship Foundation Scholarship

A scholarship is being given by the Frederic Area Scholarship Foundation. This is an organization of citizens of the Frederic community with a purpose of supporting higher education opportunities for graduating seniors of Frederic High School. It is to be given to a graduating senior based on the following criteria: class rank, difficulty of curriculum, demonstrated leadership, school/community and extra-curricular activities and/or work experience and must be used during first year immediately following the year of graduation.

The check will be given in two payments: half at the beginning of the first semester or quarter; and half at the beginning of the second semester or quarter.

Frederic Arts, Inc. Excellence in the Arts Scholarship

For purposes of this scholarship, "the Arts" are defined as Visual Arts such as painting, photography, ceramics, collage, etc.; Music Arts, vocal and instrumental; Literary Arts, writing and poetry; and Theatre Arts, drama or performance.

Awarded to a senior FHS student who demonstrates:

- exceptional talent or expression in one or more areas of the arts
- strong interest and commitment to the arts
- self-motivation
- involvement in extra-curricular arts activities

The award will be distributed after the successful completion of the first semester and proof of enrollment with at least 6 credit hours in an accredited Bachelor of Fine Arts program for the second semester.

The Harlan Shull Memorial Scholarship

In December of 1998, Harlan and Aurora Shull gifted \$25,000 to establish the Family of John and Rose Shull Scholarship (see earlier information in this booklet). Upon Harlan's death in 2010, the estate of Harlan Shull bequeathed an additional \$50,000 to establish this scholarship known as the Harlan Shull Memorial Scholarship. Harlan grew up in Frederic during the Depression and proceeded to work with Belgian horses and related farm work before enlisting in the Marines. He served three years in the South Pacific during World War II. Upon returning to civilian life, Harlan was a cattle breeder for a time and for 15 years worked as a meat cutter in the Stillwater area. He finished his working years employed by the State of Minnesota in the motor vehicle division where he worked for an additional 20 years. The scholarship was established by Harlan's brother Gerald (Joan), in an effort to continue the family legacy of providing educational assistance to graduates of Frederic High School.

This scholarship is designed to assist students to further their education in a post-high school degree program of the student's choice. The recipient's character, motivation, and high school attendance will be determining factors for this selection. There are no other parameters. The recipient must initiate schooling before the end of the calendar year in which the award was received. The check will be distributed in two payments: half at the beginning of the first semester or quarter; and half at the beginning of the second semester or quarter.

Henry Lawrence Ahlgren Educational Scholarship

This scholarship was established in 2000 to acknowledge the pride Henry had in Frederic, Polk County, and the education that he received in Frederic in the 1920s. Hank was one of the first students to leave Frederic and attend the University of Wisconsin-Madison. This was largely due to a \$150 Legislative Scholarship arranged by his high school principal, Robert Scott and his state senator, C.B. Casperson. At that time this scholarship was enough to pay tuition for the year and room and board for three months. The oldest in a family of four, Hank grew up on a small dairy farm about one mile east of the present school just off Clam Falls Drive. His parents were both Swedish immigrants and hard workers. Hank was valedictorian of his class ('27), but was unable to participate in many school activities because of farm work. He was on the football team his senior year and on the track team because his dad realized that if he ran the two miles to and from school, he could do more work! Hank graduated from UW-Madison in 1933 and went on for PhD in Agronomy. He taught agronomy, was Wisconsin Extension Director for many years and Chancellor of Extension Services at the time of his retirement in 1974. This scholarship is a celebration of opportunity and the possibility for an education for betterment that is possible in this country of immigrants.

The requirements for this scholarship include: Ranking in the top 10% of the graduating class; outstanding character; Academic attainment based on relative difficulty of curriculum; School and community activities and involvement; and Demonstrate motivation.

The recipient must initiate school before the end of the calendar year in which the award was received and will receive the actual funds as follows: half at the beginning of the first semester or quarter; and half at the beginning of the second semester or quarter.

Indianhead Credit Union Scholarship

One scholarship will be given this year by the Indianhead Credit Union to a graduating senior that the scholarship committee views as a deserving student. The criteria is only that the scholarship be given to a student going to any post-high school institution (four year college, two-year college or vocational institution) and that the student is a good citizen and is in good standing academically at the Frederic High School. The scholarship will be given at the beginning of the first semester or quarter.

Inter-County Leader Scholarship

The Inter County Cooperative Publishing Association will be giving one scholarship based on the following qualifications:

1. Difficulty of curriculum
2. Character
3. Motivation
4. The recipient must successfully complete the first semester of the current school year and start the second semester before being eligible for payment from the Inter County Cooperative Publishing Association.
5. Preferably, but not necessarily, someone interested in furthering their education in journalism, photography, sales or any field relating to newspaper production.

The James R. and Suzanne Zeiler Scholarship

To apply for this scholarship the student must have received Special Education services during some time in his or her education in the Frederic School District. This would include any student in speech, SLD, EDB, CD or any other classification of special education.

The student must hold at least a 2.25 GPA to apply for this scholarship and plan to attend a 2-year, 4-year or tech school. The student must apply in writing and indicate his/her plans for the future, the name of the college he/she plans to attend, what he/she hopes to become, and why he/she is qualified to apply for this scholarship.

The Karl D. Ludvigson Education Scholarship

This scholarship shall be awarded to a student expressing an interest in pursuing a degree in teacher education. The recipient must initiate schooling before the end of the calendar year in which the award was received and will receive the actual funds as follows: half at the beginning of the first semester or quarter; and one-half at the beginning of the second semester or quarter.

The Kaye LaRayne Heine Memorial Scholarship

Greg, Ashley, Brittney and Karl have established a scholarship in honor of Kay who passed away suddenly in March 2011. This scholarship will be awarded to a Frederic High School graduating senior entering the field of professional health care either at a 4-year college/university or a 2-year technical college. This senior should be in the top 25 of his/her class with a desire to be successful in the health field. The award will be distributed after the successful completion of the first semester. Proof of completion (grade transcript) and proof of enrollment for the second semester will be required to receive the scholarship money.

Lioness Club Scholarship

Criteria for this particular scholarship include:

1. Character and motivation
2. Academic attainment based on the relative difficulty of the curriculum
3. Attendance record in school during four years
4. School activity or involvement

The scholarship will be given in two equal payments with the first payment at the beginning of the first semester or quarter on registration day. The second half will be awarded at the beginning of the second semester or quarter. This scholarship may be used for any vocational, college or university school of the recipient's choice.

Marilyn and Phil Knuf Educational Scholarship

Qualifications:

1. Student must attend UW - Eau Claire or may currently be a student there
2. Character
3. Academic attainment based on the relative difficulty of the curriculum
4. Motivation and involvement in school activities

Two scholarships are offered, and students receiving these awards remain eligible to re-apply in succeeding years by providing the Frederic Area Scholarship Foundation a formal letter of re-application and a copy of their college or university transcript to date. Re-application must be received by April 1.

The Marty Niles Athletic Scholarship

The Marty Niles Athletic Scholarship is given in the spirit and memory of Marty Niles II. Marty was an excellent high school athlete and continued his athletic endeavors in college at Ely, Minnesota and UW-Superior. Marty was also a great role model for younger students and athletes and was also an excellent school and community citizen. The recipient need not be the highest scholastically or necessarily the most outstanding athlete, but the person(s) whose performance shows teamwork, individual effort, school spirit, sportsmanship, and community participation. Marty's goal was to become a coach to enable youth to foster teamwork, sportsmanship, and healthy activity. The scholarships are to be given to a deserving athlete, male or female, whose circumstance of need this scholarship would encourage the recipient to continue their education. Two scholarships are intended to be awarded to a male and a female athlete.

The Marty Niles Technical College Scholarship

The Marty Niles Technical College Scholarship is given in the spirit and memory of Marty Niles II. Two scholarships will be awarded, one to a female and one to a male. It is preferred to award the scholarships to students going to technical colleges, but if there is not an obvious candidate, they could be awarded to students going to college. Beyond the fact that preference goes to students going to a vocational technical school, other qualities include good citizenship, athletic participation, and community involvement.

Northwestern Wisconsin Electric Company Scholarship

Northwestern Wisconsin Electric is offering a scholarship to a graduating student who will be furthering their education in the Electrical field with either a 2- or 4-year program. The student must be attending fulltime and have completed the 1st semester with a GPA minimum of 2.0 and be enrolled in 2nd semester courses. If there is no candidate, the scholarship will be held over until the next year.

The Peggy Miller Nursing Scholarship

The Peggy Miller Nursing Scholarship is given in the memory of Peggy Miller. Peggy was a long-time Frederic resident and was married to Kirk Miller, an employee of the Frederic School District. Peggy and Kirk were both supporters of Frederic area young people and were well known by the young people attending the Frederic Schools. All the Miller children graduated from Frederic High School. The Peggy Miller Nursing Scholarship is targeted for a graduating Frederic High School senior who is pursuing a degree in the field of nursing. In addition to the prescribed field of study, scholarship recipients should be involved students and citizens who have given back to the community and school during their high school years. The recipient need not be the highest scholastically but have a strong desire to help people. The check will be given at the beginning of the first semester or quarter.

The Ray and Evelyn Moats Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established by their children, all graduates of Frederic High School. This scholarship is designed to assist students entering a service related field such as small engine or auto mechanics, medical/dental assistant, paramedic, cosmetology, appliance service, tool and die, secretarial, etc., at any recognized vocational/technical school.

Criteria for this scholarship include academic attainment based on the relative difficulty of the curriculum, character, and motivation. The award will be given to the recipient after he or she has satisfactorily completed the first term of school and is enrolled to begin the second term.

The Rowe Funeral Home Scholarship

The recipient of this scholarship must be enrolled at a school that culminates with a licensor degree in a professional area of the student's choice. The recipient must initiate schooling before the end of the calendar year in which the award was received with the actual funds being distributed as follows: half at the beginning of the first semester or quarter; and half at the beginning of the second semester or quarter. A picture of the recipient (8" x 10") is required by the donor suitable for framing.

The Spencer Family Scholarship

This scholarship is being given because of a strong belief in the value of our technical/vocational school system and the need for the occupations they provide. It will be awarded to a student pursuing studies in the trade industry (mechanical, plumbing, electrical, construction, cosmetology, and technical fields). The recipient should be a good school citizen and have good attendance. Proof of completion of the first semester and enrollment schedule for the second semester must be provided to receive the award. If there is no candidate, the scholarship will be held over until the next year.

The Wadia (Bill) Moses Scholarship

This Memorial Scholarship is in memory of Wadia Moses, a long-time resident of Frederic. After fulfilling his educational goals and marrying Grace Louise Wiseman, Wadia and his family settled in Frederic in 1934 where Wadia worked for the Frederic Auto Company as business manager. Later, he became part owner and manager of the Frederic Independent Telephone Company. When Frederic Independent Telephone merged with Continental Telephone Company in 1969, he became manager of their Northwest Wisconsin region until his retirement in 1972. For over 20 years Wadia served as a member of the Frederic Board of Education and displayed strong support for the Frederic School District. All four of his children graduated from the Frederic School District. The recipient of this scholarship should be someone that displays the following qualifications:

1. Possesses an outstanding character
2. Displays a desire to improve their marketable skills and is anxious to succeed in the adult world of work
3. The recipient need not excel in school activities or academic prowess. Rather, they may hold a job and display successful work qualities that would lead to further success in the economic community.

The recipient must initiate school before the end of the calendar year in which the award was received and will receive the actual funds as follows: half at the beginning of the first semester or quarter; and half at the beginning of the second semester or quarter.

The Warren H. Melin Memorial Scholarship

The Warren H. Melin Memorial Scholarship is given in memory of Warren H. Melin, a dedicated citizen of this area who devoted much time to local government, community activities, and had a passion for education. Because Warren was a member of the Frederic School Board for over 20 years and chaired the WITC Board during its expansion, the recipient shall be a Frederic senior planning on attending WITC. The scholarship will be paid for the 1st semester. The selected recipient shall be a senior who has demonstrated good citizenship, who has had success academically, and has been involved in school and/or community activities.
