Lincoln Junior High CHAMPS sets classroom expectations

Lincoln Junior High Principal Frank Brown knows the importance of communicating expectations when it comes to classroom behavior.

“If we all follow a set of uniform expectations, we have a greater chance of success in the classroom,” said Brown. “And it starts with classroom behavior.”

With that in mind, Brown has initiated the CHAMPS classroom management program, designed to take the guesswork out of what is expected of students and to maximize instructional time.

Every LJH teacher has the

CHAMPS chart posted in their classroom. Each letter stands for a different set of behavior expectations, with levels based on learning activities. The program has been a great success this year.

“No teacher has had a single discipline referral yet,” said Brown.

Setting clearly defined behavior expectations gives students the opportunity to succeed in a positive way.

Coldspring-Oakhurst High School AFJROTC in full force

The COHS TX-20066 Air Force JROTC activated their Leadership Development Requirement (LDR) Teams in full force at the first home game of the season on Sept. 7.

Last school year the TX-20066 Corps of Cadets received two awards of recognition from Headquarters Air Force JROTC: Distinguished Unit Award for the fifth consecutive year, and the Silver Star Community Service of Excellence Award, first year recipient.

Out of 109 AFJROTC units in Texas, TX-20066 AFJROTC and C.E. King High School were the only two units selected in the Houston area to receive the Sil-

ver Star Community Service of Excellence Award.
