National Board Certification Renewal

The National Board Certification for Professional Teaching Standards is based on 5 Core Propositions that include:

- Proposition 1:** Teachers are committed to students and their learning.
- Proposition 2:** Teachers know the subjects they teach and how to teach those subjects to students.
- Proposition 3:** Teachers are responsible for managing and monitoring student learning.
- Proposition 4:** Teachers think systematically about their practice and learn from experience.
- Proposition 5:** Teachers are members of learning communities.

Hampton School District One currently has 25 National Board Certified Teachers. At the end of the initial 10 year certificate, teachers must undergo a renewal process to recertify.

Mrs. Susan Seigler, special education teacher at **North District Middle School**, was recognized at the November 28th school board meeting by Chairman Eugene Jenkins and Dr. Ronald Wilcox for renewing her National Board Certificate.



Boardmanship Institute Recognition

Board member and leadership training is a priority for the South Carolina School Boards Association. Established in 1982, SCSBA's Boardmanship Institute offers a year-round training curriculum focused on leadership skills for board members on state and national educational issues.

Mr. Theodore V. Murdaugh was recognized at the November 28th school board meeting by **Chairman Eugene Jenkins** and **Dr. Ronald Wilcox** for completing Level Four boardmanship training. An individual who has completed Level 4 has earned 200 points in 4 consecutive years or less.

In addition, **Mr. Phillip Strother, Sr.**, was also recognized by **Chairman Eugene Jenkins** and **Dr. Ronald Wilcox** for completing Level Two boardmanship training. An individual who has completed Level 2 has earned 40 points in 1 year.
