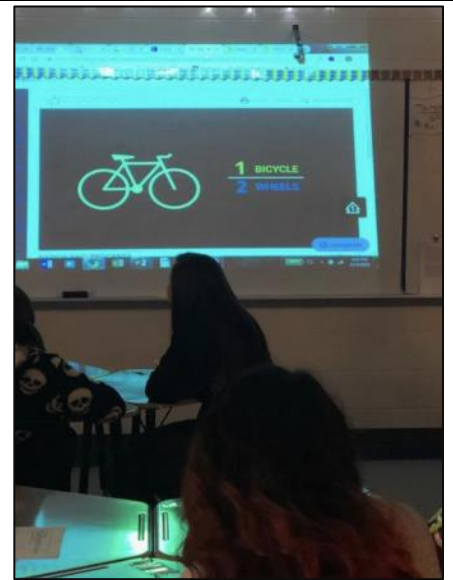

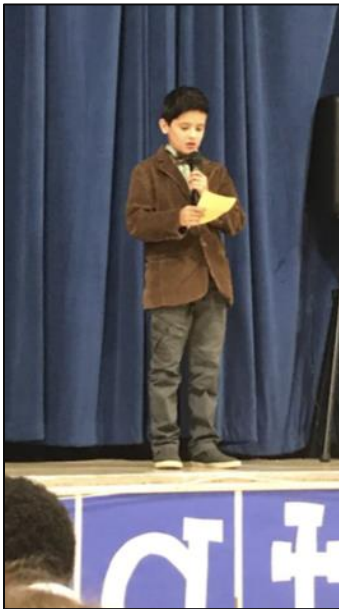
Students Prep for STEM Competition
