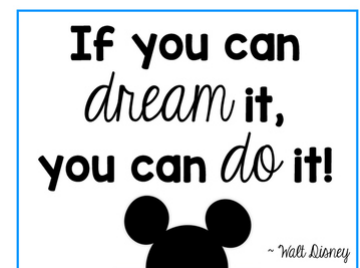

FROM P.B.I.S. COMMITTEE: HOW TO PRAISE YOUR CHILD

THREE BEST WAYS TO PRAISE

1. Don't overdo it. When your toddler puts his pants on by himself for the first time, it's worth making a big deal about it. But gushing over everyday achievements ("You finished your carrots—yay!") will cause your child to discount praise he's truly earned. It may also make him feel he constantly has to do things to impress you.
2. Be specific. Instead of saying, "Wow, that's a great drawing", say, "Look at that great sun you made, and you even included clouds!" This lets your child know you are really taking notice of her work and encourages her to do more, says Janice Fletcher, EdD, Director of the child development lab at the University of Idaho.
3. Emphasize the effort, not the outcome. When your child is learning a new activity, don't comment on how well she does it. Instead, compliment her enthusiasm and progress. For example, "You worked really hard in soccer, and I noticed you're starting to dribble the ball better."
