

District 4 fifth graders celebrate 'Wonder Day'

All Addison School District 4, 5th grade students took part in Wonder Day activities at Army Trail School on Thursday, Dec. 13. The students had read "Wonder," the story of a boy born with severe facial differences who enters fifth grade in a mainstream school after having been home schooled. More than 400 fifth graders and their teachers had each created a puzzle piece on which they'd written an important life precept. The students were divided into mixed groups and assembled the puzzles, which were then hung on the gymnasium walls. Students then watched the movie Wonder, seeing the inspiring story of Auggie Pullman, a boy who faced many of the same challenges that any 5th grader might.
