

Schools were awarded gold, silver, or bronze medals based on their performance on state assessments and how well they prepare students for college. Red Jacket High School came in at #1,807 nationally and ranked in the top 3rd across New York State!

- The Foundation State Aid Formula for schools is based on the expectation of local property taxes funding a share of the school's budget. For Red Jacket, however, there is a shortfall of approximately \$1.97 MILLION in Foundation Aid from the State!
- Almost 50% of our students receive a free or reduced lunch price, which is just under the 50% threshold that is used to qualify for grant funding opportunities.
 - There are nearly 140 State and Federal mandates, most of which are not funded, and the number of nonfunded mandates continues to grow.
- The uncontrolled escalation of expenditures associated with health insurance, pensions, and worker's compensation add to the school's budgeting challenges.
- The high cost of special education placements and services continues to grow. School's need
 to be able to establish a reserve fund for high cost student placements to help stabilize the
 budget year to year.
