How is the Homeless Education Liaison made aware of the Title I Homeless Set-Aside funds?

When we conducted survey, 40% of our students were considered homeless although multi-generational living situation is not considered homeless for Native American communities. As a result, we set aside funding for 100% of our students for pencils, paper, glue, scissors, supplies, markers, book bags as needed or requested, or any other supplies needed daily from teachers and students. We also provide free breakfast and lunch for 100% of students. In addition, all field trips and quarterly incentive trips are paid 100% by the school using impact aid funds. Dental services provided by Indian Health Services.

In the past, they also provided free vision and hearing screening but we are training our staff now as prior nurse left the Peach Springs area. Services were contracted out this year by staff from Kingman USD during their break sessions.
