Volunteers are essential to the success of SAYL's Reading Buddy program! Reading Buddies must be at least seventeen years old and be able to commit at least one hour per week, for a full school year, approximately 16 sessions. During this time, the volunteer works one-on-one with two students, each for thirty minutes. If Reading Buddies are able to commit to more time each week, they are encouraged to work more than the minimum requirement of one hour.

Our on-site CRIT-USA volunteers help our children and their families in many different ways. The program matches volunteers with children currently receiving rehabilitation services at our center. The volunteers spend one-on-one time with a specific child or teen while participating in fun activities at our facility or while on outings in the community —such as to parks, museums, and farms.

Additionally, among other things our volunteers may:

- Accompany the children and their families while at the facility so they can guide them to their rehabilitation therapies and other appointments.
- Lead tours for new families and other visitors.
- Serve as translators (English and Spanish) for children and their families while they are at the Facility.
- Organize craft and other workshops for parents and fun activities for children to help them pass the waiting time between appointments.
- Provide childcare in the children's room at the facility while parents are meeting with caseworkers.
- Help with light office work, such as answering the phone and filing papers.
