High School Senior Voluntarism Scholarship

The Voluntarism Scholarships were established in 1986 as a gift to the community as part of JLM's 50th anniversary celebration. Scholarships are awarded based on the applicant's demonstrated commitment to voluntarism. Secondary criteria include leadership, extra-curricular activities, scholastic effort and family responsibilities. Financial need is not considered. Both male and female students are eligible to apply.

Do you know someone who you would recommend for a \$2,500 scholarship for outstanding volunteers? The Junior League of Morristown, Inc. (JLM) is offering four scholarships to students who reside or attend school in Morris and Somerset counties and are planning to attend an accredited college or trade school next year. **Application Deadline: January 31st.**

In order to apply for any of the scholarships, you must apply to [Seton Hall University](#). However, you may apply for the scholarship prior to notification of admission. The criteria listed below determines eligibility only and does not guarantee receipt of the scholarship.

Catholic High School Achievement Award

Deadline: January 15

Amount: \$2,000, renewable

Eligibility: Incoming freshmen attending Catholic high schools with a minimum of an unweighted 3.0 GPA and a 1350 SAT (new) or 29 ACT as well as a strong record of involvement in their high school, community or church.

Application Process: No application required, automatically awarded to eligible student

Application: n/a

The [Catholic High School Achievement Award](#) is a competitive scholarship awarded exclusively to incoming freshmen currently enrolled in a Catholic high school who have a minimum of an unweighted 3.0 GPA and a 1350 SAT (new) 1290 SAT two-score (old) or 29 on the ACT as well as a strong record of involvement in your high school, community or church. This \$2,000 award

is renewable for three additional years for a total award of \$8,000 as long as the student maintains a 3.0 GPA and earns at least 30 credits annually. There is no application required for this scholarship; the scholarship is automatically awarded to students who meet the eligibility requirements shortly after admission. Forensics, Speech and Debate Scholarship

Deadline: January 15

Amount: \$2,000 - \$8,000, renewable

Eligibility: Incoming freshman and incoming transfers who will participate in Seton Hall's Brownson Speech and Debate Team and who display outstanding academic achievement and public speaking ability.

Available to incoming freshmen and transfer students who will participate in Seton Hall's Brownson Speech and Debate Team and who display outstanding academic achievement and public speaking ability. These renewable scholarships are awarded in the fall semester and range from \$2,000 to \$8,000. Students must maintain a 3.0 GPA. The completed application form and your application for admission must be received by the scholarship deadline.



The Elaine Ehlers Arts Scholarship (\$5,000) and Eugenie Coladarci Arts Scholarship (\$1,500) are offered annually by Morris Arts to two graduating high school seniors who demonstrate artistic excellence in dance, drama, music or visual arts and plan to pursue further study in an area related to the arts. **Deadline: January 18, 2019**


