

A Jewel of the Waldorf Curriculum: *Eurythmy!*

An introductory talk by Andrea Paz (formally Andrea Moreno-Beals)



★ Are you curious about what the Art of Eurythmy is? Where does it come from? What does it look like? Why is it a central part of Waldorf schools around the world? What does it offer the development of your growing child?

Ms. Paz completed her Eurythmy training this past July in Dornach, Switzerland. Immediately following her graduation, she spent three weeks on tour performing Eurythmy for children and adult audiences in Waldorf Schools and public theaters in Colombia, Brazil and Argentina. Before becoming a Eurythmist, she worked as a professional, independent musician performing and recording nationally and internationally.



Ms. Paz is a graduate from our very own RSSAA! She is fluent in both German and Brazilian Portuguese. After much time working artistically and traveling the world, she finds herself right back here in the Waldorf community she grew up in. She has been teaching Eurythmy blocks in our high school all fall, and is very excited to begin teaching Eurythmy in our lower school this month.
