A. Principal

It is planned to bring all of the schools in the complex to meet together. They will meet for at least ½ of the day and then return to their schools after lunch.

V. New Business

1. Update regarding the school’s WASC Accreditation Visit

The WASC exemption has been approved for Kamiloiki and Aina Haina Schools.

The I.B. Program will be substituted for the WASC requirements. Koko Head Elementary School is not involved since they are WASC approved.

The budget for the school hasn’t been received.

2. Sharing of insights and perspective in the development of the school’s Salaried Financial Plan

The budget for the school hasn’t been received. The school’s Salaried Financial plan needs to be developed and submitted by December. It has been asked to be kept the same as last year. The enrollment was projected as 388, but the actual count is 390 students.

3. School’s use of lower field at Kamilo’iki Park

A letter has been crafted to the parents regarding the situation of the use of “C Field” for parking when there is a special event at Kamiloiki School. The former director of the “Rec Center”, Arleen, has retired. When the new director was asked about placing the Keiki Carnival banner on the corner of the park, a sequence of events resulted in which the school not being granted the use of C Field for Carnival parking. However, a one-time exemption was given for this year’s Keiki Carnival. Mr.

Yoshimoto has written a letter to the Mayor, City Council, and the City Department of Parks and Recreation in an attempt to go through the proper channels for the school to be given permission to use C Field for parking during future events. If this request is denied, then the school will explore its options on how to move forward.
